HE Girls' Court, with four senior and four junior judges, holds jurisdiction over all types of offenses committed in school. Two of the eight judges meet each of the first four days of the week, and on Friday the entire court meets to discuss difficult or interesting cases, which may have come up during the week.

The procedure of the court is as follows: the C. P. states the case, the defendant is then permitted to state her case; after this any witnesses are heard. The senior judges do the interrogation; the junior judge is permitted to question. Then the C. P., witness, and defendant leave the room while the judges deliberate and after the deliberation they are recalled for the sentence.

HE Boy's Court has just completed a very successful year under the leadership of its seven judges. These include three senior judges and four junior judges. At the beginning of the school year, his colleagues elected Fred Brown to the position of chief justice.

The Court's cases ranged from smoking on the school grounds to being off-grounds during school hours. The court follows stern procedure in dealing with its cases. The C. P. who issued the summons states the case as he sees it. The offender is given an opportunity to defend himself, and then the judges make their decision. The customary penalty is detention, although in extreme cases the defendants are referred to the school authorities, who determine the penalties.



Safety Council

HE Safety Council was organized to reduce and prevent accidents through a better understanding of their causes. It is a member of the National Safety Council and is coöperating with the national and local organizations in their efforts to educate the student in those habits of courtesy, common sense, and care in daily life that will tend to reduce and prevent accidents. This Council is composed of 120 students supervised by an executive committee of 12 students and 12 teachers. The students are juniors and seniors who are divided into the following committees: automobile, school patrol, street patrol, shop, sports, fire prevention, speaking, first aid, home, poster, and publicity.

During the year talks and motion pictures on safety were presented under the auspices of this Council. Students who drove cars to school were required to have parking permits issued by the automobile committee. With the cooperation of the mathematics department the school patrol conducted a survey of such school hazards as running in the halls and bursting through doors. Small signs were placed conspicuously on both sides of all the doors in the building reminding people to push, pull, or open slowly. This year our Safety Council was one of the most active in the state.





Football

HE 1937 football season was not a very brilliant one, the final record of the team standing at four games won, four lost, and two tied. Having lost most of last year's regulars, Coach Harold P. Wasson had to start a fairly inexperienced eleven against Cranford as the season opened. As the season progressed, however, the team gained the needed experience and was soon turning in creditable performances. In the opener with Cranford, East Orange, although badly outplayed, broke a scoreless deadlock with a pass from Curry to Burke in the last two minutes of play and won the game, 6-0.

The next Saturday, their playing with West Side was very erratic, and the decision

was lost by the score of 12-0.

Then Morristown came to Ashland Stadium, and, upsetting the proverbial apple-

cart, handed a fighting East Orange team a 7-0 upset.

The next visitor to Ashland Stadium was West Orange, who defeated the Red and Blue decisively, 21-0; but three weeks later, because of the ineligibility of a West Orange player, East Orange suddenly became the winner.

The succeeding game was played at Plainfield, where East Orange twice came from behind to tie up the score, and ultimately to win by one point, 13-12. Curry and McManus scored the two touchdowns, and Moore caught a pass from Curry to provide

the winning point.

The Montclair game was postponed because of rain, and the following Monday saw an irrepressible Montclair eleven overcome a seven-point lead to tie East Orange at 14-all. Sundheim fell on a blocked punt in the end zone, and McManus took a lateral from Curry and ran 65 yards, to furnish the two touchdowns. Moore won the two extra points by dint of two perfect placement kicks.

Probably the best game of the season was played against the highly favored Nutley team, which was repeatedly outrushed by the Panthers and barely managed to break through in the last five minutes of play to win 12-7. East Orange scored on the opening kickoff when McManus threw a lateral pass. The ball bounded past Olcott and was

picked up by Captain Healy, who scored.

The following Saturday, after outplaying the Orange team, East Orange left the field on the long end of a 6-0 count, by virtue of Costelloe's touchdown upon picking up a fumble.

Another game was postponed, this time with Columbia. The two teams met at Underhill Field the following Wednesday, and Columbia emerged the winner by the score of 25-0. The game was well played by East Orange in view of the fact that


its team was considerably outweighed.

The traditional Barringer game on Thanksgiving day was played at Ashland Stadium and resulted in a scoreless tie. The Blue was favored to win and almost scored a touchdown toward the end of the second period. Because of a fumbled kick, Barringer received an opportunity to score and immediately did so, but the play was nullified and Barringer penalized. Then on the one-yard line, with goal to go, the Big Blue shot one play at the center of East Orange's line, which was piled up; and before they had another chance, the gun ending the half was fired. During the second half the two teams pushed each other back and forth, neither side gaining the advantage. The starting lineup for this game was as follows: Olcott and Costelloe, ends; Lown and Lunger, tackles; Honigfeld and Sanders, guards; Healy, center; Moore and Curry, halfbacks; Hundley, quarterback; and McManus, fullback.

Honorable mention should go to Olcott, Lown, Honigfeld, Healy, Sanders, Lunger, Costelloe, Sundheim, Rothlisberger, Doudt, Mauriello, Hamilton, Files, Duffey, and Burke for a grand bit of offensive and defensive work on the line throughout the season; to Moore for his sensational kicking and pass receiving; to McManus and Hundley for their hard line plunging and great defensive work; to Curry and King for their brilliant passes; to Wilson, Brown, Johnson, Mulvihill, and Brodbeck for some excellent backfield duty; and to Hinman and Manitz, the two managers, who

carried on behind the scenes and did as good a job as the players themselves.

Although the record does not seem very impressive, it is no indication of a poor season, for the 1937 eleven, led by Captain Dave Healy, played excellent football, each senior who played twenty quarters receiving, in commendation for his good work, a gold football.



Basketball

THE 1937-38 basketball season began for East Orange with a loss to the Alumni team by a margin of one point, 20-19. The quintet, however, defeated the next five opponents: Nutley, 33-24; Verona, 44-19; Orange, 33-27; Irvington, 39-33; and Nutley again, 38-22.

After losing the seventh game to Montclair, 28-26, and the eighth to Columbia, the Red and Blue were victorious over Madison with a score of 40-22. Then Orange snowed the Panthers under, the score being 34-25, and Montclair took its second game of the season, 29-23. The team now won over West Orange, 21-19, and then defeated Kingsley, 28-24. Next Bloomfield, last year's Group 4 champions, submerged the Red and Blue beneath a landslide of 40-24.

Because of the exacting toll of a strenuous 15-game schedule, the team was not permitted to participate in the state tournament; and its hope of winning the Inter-Oranges Championship vanished when West Orange won the final game, 26-22, despite East Orange's brave attempt to hold its early lead.

Outstanding performances were given by the entire team and those who relieved them at various instances. Captain "Happy" Lieder's consistently versatile playing, "Red" Herdic's record of over one hundred points during the season, Sandy Sobel's and Jack Scott's fine defensive and offensive work, and Bob Duffey's aggressiveness deserve mention, as does the able relief work of George Olcott, Bill Carr, and John Josephson, and the excellent work of Alexander Bell as manager.

When the season is taken in retrospect, there is no cause for criticism; rather, high commendation should be given to those boys who, in playing their first year of varsity competition, have left such a good record behind them.

Baseball

Shortly following this, however, Orange and St. Benedict's applied the humiliating whitewash brush, and a 3-2 victory over Kingsley proved our last, as the second season of revived baseball at E.O.H.S. ended with a disastrous 9-7 conquest by Verona.

It was certainly a discouraging season for the boys, but they showed fine spirit, and the following ten of them were awarded their letters: Joe Moore, catcher; Fred Fierro and "Happy" Lieder, pitchers; Tom Riley, first base; Nate Johnson, second base; Angelo Piccirillo, third base; Joseph Fitzgerald, shortstop; Frank Sharkey, Johnny Bellina, Bill Hance, Bill Virtue, and David Resnikoff, fielders.

We hope that the future teams will become better and better as the sport becomes more firmly established in our athletics and that they will win a name in baseball for East Orange High.

Soccer

THE 1937 fall campaign saw the East Orange Soccer Team play a ten-game schedule with a record of five victories, four defeats, and one tie.

The 1937 season brought with it a drastic change in timing: the elimination of quarters and the substitution of two thirty-minute halves. This change had a sad effect on the Red and Blue in their first Verona game, which they lost, 5-1.

Although they lost to a fine Montclair team, 1-0, they won from St. Benedict's by the same score. Then the Cougars defeated Summit, 2-0. On the return engagement with Montclair, the Griffin charges fared worse, this time losing the contest by the score of 2-0; St. Benedict's, however, again fell victim to East Orange, which won, 4-2. A strong Kearny outfit clearly outclassed the local team, and except for Lieder's able goal tending, would have administered a sounder trouncing than the 3-0 score indicates. The only tie was that resulting from the Chatham game, in which East Orange was handicapped by the loss of Pat Morano. The Summit game, the season's last, was efficiently captured by a score of 2-1.






THE first meet of the season, the N. Y. U. meet, saw Hansen and Ackerman as the only East Orange entries. Hansen took a fourth in the shot put, and Ackerman won the high hurdles in record time.

When East Orange did not figure in the Newark Open Meet, a disastrous season was predicted. Nor did the chances look too bright when the Red and Blue captured only a third place in the Montclair Invitation Meet.

Then Hansen and Ackerman gained 19 points between them in a tie for third at the Princeton Interscholastics on May 8. Hansen won the shot and discus, and Ackerman won the high hurdles and took a second in the low hurdles.

The season ended with the State Meet in Montclair, which East Orange, although conceded only an outside chance, unexpectedly won, thus climaxing the 1937 season by successfully defending the coveted Group 4 title for the second consecutive year. Led by Captain Norm Hansen, and by Jerry Ackermann and Ernie Fellows, the Red and Blue nosed out Montclair by a score of 27-25. Ed Jagger, with a fifth in the pole vault, and Bill Taylor and Ames Betts, with a tie for third in the high jump, also contributed to the final scoring.

Moreover, the dual meet was kept spotless for the fourth consecutive year after victories over West Side and South Side, thus giving to East Orange a much better record than anyone had expected.



Fencing

NCE again the East Orange High School fencing team has achieved a formidable position in Eastern interscholastic team and individual foils competition, and in so doing, has terminated a season in which we may all take great pride.

This year's team, coached by Arthur Federick and managed by Gerald Kalb, established a string of fifteen consecutive triumphs in dual meet competition before bowing to Barringer's championship team in the last engagement of the season. Earlier in the year, however, the Cougars had handed the Big Blue a thrilling 5-4 setback. In this contest, as in almost all the others, Captain Peter Milone and Al Sully figured prominently. Up to the last meet of the season Milone had compiled a record of thirty-four straight dual meet triumphs. His outstanding accomplishment, however, was winning the New Jersey interscholastic individual foils crown.

East Orange also defeated the Alumni and Snyder, once each; and Lincoln, Bloomfield, Abraham Clark, South Side, New Brunswick, Thomas Jefferson twice each. In addition, East Orange competed for the Biddle trophy, but was eliminated in the quarter-final round by Stuyvesant High of New York.

Peter Milone and Gerald Kalb will graduate, leaving Al Sully, Jules Batlan, Roy Hatchman, and Sheldon Siegel to form the nucleus of next year's squad.






