These measures have helped the Council, a comparatively new organization, to secure outstanding results in decreasing accidents.






The Band

Red and Blue Orchestra




## Dramatics

## Glee Club






## Social Committee

Immediately upon his arrival at East Orange, Mr. Shotwell started his extensive training. The Pitt power plays which he introduced clicked all

season with unfailing regularity.


Cranford again was the opponent in the opening game and was taken over by the score of 9-0. West Side, however, proved to be too much for the Red and Blue's inexperienced team. Fumbling was one of the main handicaps in the game, and East Orange lost one touchdown by a dropped pass. The game ended with the ball one foot from the Green goal and the score 13-6. Those who saw in the West Side game the beginning of a line of defeats were far from correct. A week later Morristown felt the Panther's claws and was pushed under by 28-0. Only grim hard fighting kept West Orange from crossing the goal line in a thrilling tie, 0-0. More than once East Orange was forced back to the last few yards and then took command of the field and held the Mountaineers with a wall of steel. Plainfield could offer only a weak resistance and lost, 21-0. Supposedly a strong team, Montclair entertained the East Orange visitors lavishly by succumbing with the same score as weak Plainfield, 21-0. Nutlev had been undefeated since the season of 1936 and unscored upon in 1938. The prophets were not merely suprised; they were overcome at the 21-0 victory that East Orange relentlessly pushed over. The Orange let-down after the Nutley game was natural. The weather was hot, and it sapped the energy of both teams. The only score was on a pass which Bob Files carried over the line for the winning touchdown and a score of 7-0.

Those who missed the first few minutes of the Columbia game might just as well have stayed home. On the opening kickoff of the game, Nat Johnson carried the ball eighty-two yards with perfect blocking for a sensational touchdown. Captain Fred Brown's usual faultless place-kicking made the score 7-0. From then on it was a grim struggle, which lasted until Columbia, in a well-executed side-line pass, scored six points; when the attempt for a conversion was unsuccessful, Columbia ended it all with a storm of frantic passes. This 7-6 victory is the first East Orange has won from Columbia since 1932.

In the Barringer game, although the day threatened snow, Ashland Stadium was filled to capacity, leaving only standing room. The first half of the game was uneventful, and the two teams went to the showers with no blood drawn by either side. Shortly after the opening of the third quarter, Barringer made a touchdown that seemed to be the deciding score of the game. The score stood 6-0. Against this apparently insurmountable obstacle East Orange showed what real spirit can be. For sixty-eight yards the Red and Blue kept the ball in its possession; and at the end of the third quarter, little, one-hundred-and-ten-pound Bennett carried the pigskin around right end for a well-earned score. The try for the extra point was unsuccessful, and the score stood 6-6. From this point the game was all East Orange's. The Pitt power plays clicked, and the final touchdown at the end of the fourth quarter was earned and achieved by fine blocking and expert ball-carrying.

An extra incentive toward winning was the desire of the team to carry on for Jack Garrabrant, who became twenty years old the day before Thanksgiving and therefore ineligible to play.

In his first year at East Orange Mr. Shotwell has brought the Panthers to the first Inter-Oranges title they have ever held in any sport and helped us even the score with Barringer. East Orange, second in the state according to the officially recognized Colliton system, is back where she belongs in the football world.

Griffin has led his team through another successful season. In the regular schedule East Orange won nine out of thirteen games and then lost to Bloom-

field in the state championship play-offs.

The Varsity started by beating the Alumni, 38-14. Nutley, the second opponent, although it had previously won four games, lost by the large margin of 18-32. In the Columbia game, with two minutes left to play, Bob Duffey sank a goal that made the score 16-15; and Ray Herdic, with a foul shot, ended the scoring, 17-15 in East Orange's favor. After a rough but clean battle which ended 26-24, the Tornadoes of Orange gave East Orange its first defeat of the season.

Ken Boehm played his first varsity game against Irvington, helping East Orange win by a 43-33 count against a weak and disorganized team. Nutley revenged herself by winning the second game between the schools this season, the final score being 27-25. Montclair handed East Orange its third defeat by winning 35-31 in a game played at Montclair's court. By defeating Columbia, 29-25, East Orange remained in the running for the inter-Oranges' championship. This game, which East Orange won 17-15, was almost a repetition of the first one of the season. Then being beaten by East Orange at the East Orange gymnasium (29-24) cost Orange the inter-Oranges' basketball championship which it had held for nine years. Later East Orange proved by trampling Montclair 35-28, that she could not be beaten on her own court.

West Orange next bowed to the tune of 26-20; but Bloomfield outscored the Panthers, 41-35, and a week later also won the state tournament, 44-30. By beating West Orange in the last regular game of the season, however, East Orange won the inter-Oranges' basketball crown for the first

time in history.

karis as coach, the East Orange Fencing Team has had another brilliant season, winning thirteen out of nineteen matches as well as defeating several local club teams. Under the leadership of Captain Sully, the team, composed of Rufo Sanchez, Ted Garrabrants, Sheldon Seigel, Julian Batlan, and Bill Wyrough, took third place in the National Interclass Fencing Meet at New York this year.

Fencing has the longest season of any high school sport. It starts in late November and ends in late March or early April. The schedule is an arduous and difficult one because of the large variety in teams met. High schools, preparatory schools, clubs and academies all are opponents at some time during the season. 

### Track

• In spite of a loss of many members from last year's championship team, the 1938 season started with East Orange's winning eleven out of twelve events in a meet with South Side at its stadium. By taken the broad jump with a leap of twenty feet, one inch, Hicks of South Side prevented a clean sweep. At the meet with Thomas Jefferson High School, held in Elizabeth, East Orange made a score of 65-52 and ended that school's twelve-meet winning streak. Paul Jolcuvar and Bill Booth between them scored 23 points.

In the annual interclass meet, the junior class was victorious over the sophomores, 47-38, while the senior managed to score only 14 points, although they made all four places in the shot put. The juniors had the two

highest scorers, Orr with 10 points and Jackson with 8.

The biggest value from the season was in the experience and training for the future members of the team.

· With wins and losses


almost equal in number the baseball team, now an official school team, completed a fair season.
