We hold dear to our hearts three officers, elected amid much strife, confusion, and glory: President, C. Roberts; Vice-President, W. Conkling; Secretary, E. Granger.

We are establishing ourselves more surely in active high school life, in clubs and on teams, and taking part in the try-outs. Some of us are, to our joy, given parts in MR. SIMPSON'S CASTLE, THE LATE CHRISTOPHER BEAN, and ROBIN HOOD, noteworthy productions of a memorable year. A Christmas concert is held by the Glee Club, with many of our lusty young voices heralding the glad new year. The Student Council comes forth with its "Obra Maestra," the EOHS Handbook. We were loyal—now they are souvenirs. The G. O. has voted funds to bind back issues of the NEWS in 40 volumes for posterity, and in the fall we bade adieu to Miss Lilla Birge, already beloved by some of us. The year ends in a burst of glory when the E. O. orchestra and octet win first place in the state contest at Albany.

History

of Ferdinand Forty, Sr!

For the year 1938-1939:

Some 80% of us are completely and thoroughly dry. This is a triumphant year, for we take our place with the Highest Order, fully established and accepted. Some of our members take leading and active parts in the much-heralded TEMPEST, in THE NIGHTINGALE, and HOLLY AND CYPRESS. The Speech and Dramatics Department comes forth with PIERRE L'AVOCAT on a silver tray. IN LITTLE OLD NEW YORK comes from the faithful Cinematography Club, and all the teachers move in on and completely put out one issue of the NEWS. Mr. Shotwell has taken charge of a glorious eleven, matching brawn with brain, and coaching us on to victory, while for the class as a whole the guiding lights of the year have been Charles Roberts, William Conkling, and Bette Poston, President, Vice-President, and Secretary respectively.

For the year 1939-1940:

The morning sun shines brightly—Can it be that we are finally seniors? For a few weeks smugness sits contentedly on our features, and then the novelty begins to wear off. After a bit we are bored with life and routine. Then, bang! PAT STANDS PAT in magnificent triumph,—a smashing, two-day success—a musical comedy replete with chorus, Ozzie Porter, and songs! Life leans toward the brighter side—our football team is covered in shining glory—eleven,—er, twelve little halos and a trophy. Oh, yes, they'll remember the Class of '40! We enter rather half-heartedly into a Citizenship Essay Contest, sponsored by the NEWS and won by Jean Gillette, and cheer wildly when THE DOUBLE DOOR opens.

Then our basketball team finishes the year in triumphant victory, winning the Inter-Orange League Championship for the second successive time and the State Championship for the first time in the history of the school. On the following Monday at a special assembly each member of the team is awarded a gold belt buckle, and the trophy and the basketball used in the winning game are displayed.

The climax of our social life comes in the Grad Dance, held on April 27. Then we settle down to the last burst of studying with no more merry-making until after we have received our diplomas.

(And it was the strain of these last hectic days that caused the demise of Mr. Forty, as explained in the Foreword.)

We see test tubes, rack on rack, bottles of chemicals, culture media. Bent low over a microscope is Joseph Gruber, minutely making notes—a young man whose name promises to live in the annals of science. Among the laboratory technicians deftly preparing serums are Doris Jorgensen and June Boyle.

After showing scenes in New York, Reiter and Hanle focus the machine






The Orchestra





the different aspects of newspaper work were talked over.



Football

• For two consecutive years the East Orange football team has ended the season with outstanding records. Undefeated in 17 games, the team has been second in the state for the past two years under the Colliton System of rating the New Jersey high schools, its only defeat last year being that by West Side.

The Panthers began the 1939 season with the traditional game with Cranford. As in the previous year, their first game was replete with errors, though the team won a two-point victory over the Cranford squad. Muddling their only chance to make a touchdown by a poor pass from center, the Red and Blue lost the one real offensive thrust of the game. The score

came by a safety made in the first few plays.

This unimpressive showing looked bad for East Orange, destined to meet a very strong West Side team the next Saturday. Coach Shotwell drilled his men so stiffly on the field that the Panthers defeated West Side 7-0 at Ashland Stadium, out-playing the Green in every phase of the game. Driving from the 40-yard line, after a West Side fumble recovered by Joe Digiore, the passes of Brodbeck to Duffey and runs by Bennett and Grecco brought the ball to rest on the one-yard line. On the next play George Bennett plunged over the line for the score, after which Frank Schettino converted the extra point.

The team next met Morristown, and by capitalizing on the enemy's

every mistake, the Red and Blue scored a 20-0 victory.

In the annual meeting of East Orange and West Orange, the Panthers struck off by a seven-point margin the first of the contenders for the Inter-Oranges League Championship. In the first half the team made a mighty drive towards the West Orange goal only to lose the ball on a fumble. In the second quarter a blocked kick by Bob Duffey on the 44-yard line gave the team another chance, but they met strong opposition and lost the ball on downs. After this setback the team again passed and ran its way to the one-yard line, only to have the half end before they could score. The check to these disappointments came when George Bennett streakd 85 yards in the last minutes of play for a touchdown. Frank Schettino converted and the game was over, East Orange winning 7-0.

East Orange then overwhelmed Plainfield by the second largest score of the season, 27-0. The Red and Blue proved to be too strong for the Plainfield eleven, who struggled vainly against the East Orange second and third string varsity. Cortez and Whitney, reeling off the yards behind efficient blocking, were the Red and Blue's main threat throughout the game.

Meeting a strong Montclair team, the Panthers upset them by sixteen points. Bob Files, who was unable to see action in the West Orange game, played his usual brilliant and hard fighting game against the Mounties. Because of a broken leg, Jim Collins was unable to play during the remainder of the season.

A capacity crowd filled the Ashland Stadium to witness one of the best games of the year, that between East Orange and Nutley. The two teams met on an equal basis, neither having been defeated or tied. The Panthers, making the first score of the game but failing to make the extra point, were ahead 6-0. Later on a return punt by Nutley, East Orange lost the ball on a fumble, which was recovered by Nutley on the 30-yard line. From there the Nutley eleven marched for a touchdown, but also failed to make the conversion. The game ended in a 6-6 draw.

The team next showed their strength by defeating Orange at the Municipal Stadium, Orange. Duffy's snagging of passes, and Bennett's superb

running piled up the largest score of the season, 34-7.

East Orange handed Columbia its first defeat of the season, and thereby clinched the Inter-Oranges Championship for the first time. Bennett on the opening play tore through a large hole off left tackle and sprinted the length of the field behind excellent blocking for the first score. Frank Schettino converted, and the score stood at 7-0 before anyone knew what had hap-


pened. The team then rolled up 19 points to the Cougar's 4.


In the annual Turkey Day classic, the Red and Blue rolled up a 14-0 victory over a hard fighting Barringer team. East Orange outclassed Barringer in practically every phase of the game. In the first period the Panthers scored the first touchdown with Frank Grecco plunging over the line. The point after the touchdown failed, and the score remained 6-0 at the end of the half. The Barringer eleven tried vainly to drive deep into East Orange territory, only to be pushed back again and again. The Panther powerhouse in the second half rolled up eight more points before the game ended. This completed a successful season for the Red and Blue.

Fencing

• Although the fencing team felt deeply the loss of last year's captain, Alphonse Sully, the position was very capably filled by the versatile Rufo Sanchez. Under the able guidance of Coach Don Cetrulo, Rufo led the squad through a stiff season of eighteen meets in which the team bowed to four opponents only. This remarkable record warranted the awarding of medals to the squad.

Starting the season, the Red and Blue fencers met Lincoln on the former's home court. Here Rufo captured three matches out of the necessary five. The meet ended, 7-2, in E.O.'s favor. Next they toppled Arts High, 7-2, with Sanchez and Garrabrants winning two matches apiece. Meeting Bloomfield, the E.O. foilsmen kept their record unmarred by defeating their opponents 6-3. Later the team won over the College High fencers, 8-1, and then over Thomas Jefferson and South Side, 7-2 and 9-0 respectively.

The next meet against Central High ended the long winning spurt with the score 4-5. Rufo Sanchez added two victories, while Art Lindstrom and Eldred Harris each accounted for one. The following meet saw the team win, 7-2, over the Montclair squad. Sanchez again led with two wins; and Art Lindstrom, Edson Garrabrants, Bill Wyrough, Eldred Harris, and Myron Fuerstein also emerged victorious.

The victory over Weequahic by a 6-3 margin somewhat annulled the disappointing defeat at the hands of Barringer, 3-6. In the meet against Lincoln the team streaked through to win 6-3, and then fell to defeat in the next two meets to Central and Barringer, 6-3 and 5-4 respectively.

Arts High lost 5-4 to the Red and Blue, and in return meets against Weequahic and Bloomfield, the team also triumphed, upsetting the former, 5-4, and the latter, 6-3. Then the team lost, 6-3, the return engagement with South Side; but in the final meet of the season the Red and Blue foilers topped the Thomas Jefferson squad, 7-2.

Next year's squad will feel deeply the loss of Rufo Sanchez. This year's letter men were Will Wyrough, Eldred Harris, Rufo Sanchez, and Art Lindstrom. Garrabrants, who was out most of the season because of illness, will be back this coming year to form the nucleus of the 1941 squad.

Basketball

• In the opening game of the season the Red and Blue cagers, captained by the versatile Jim "Red" Herdic, defeated the Alumni, 38-22; then in the next game they defeated Nutley, 37-27. The team got its first taste of Inter-Orange competition in the game with Columbia, which it lost 21-19. The following game cost Orange its first defeat by a 24-12 margin.

The team met its second defeat at the hands of Irvington, 12-9; but in the return game with Nutley the Red and Blue again won, 42-28. Then came victories over the undefeated Montclair five, 35-29, and over Verona,

46-32.

The following game the team lost to Weequahic, 41-28; their next game against Orange the Panthers won by a one-point margin, 29-28. Then playing the Mounties for the second duel, the team won again, 32-31; this victory was followed by another over West Orange, 38-30, which gave the team the lead in the Inter-Orange League.

At Columbia the Red and Blue assured themselves of at least a tie in the League by defeating the Lions, 41-30. Next came a victory over Bloomfield, 27-21, which raised the team's hope for the coming State Tourney. Except for the State Tourney, the game against the W. O. Cowboys wound up the already impressive season with a score of 32-23 in E. O.'s favor.

In East Orange's first Tourney contest, the team toppled the Paterson East Side five by the score of 43-39. The game was played at the Orange Armory before a capacity crowd, with Duffey and Roberts starting for E. O. In the second battle at the Armory, that against W. O., the team defeated the Cowboys, 44-30; and then on the next Saturday they eliminated Orange, 31-24, thus placing East Orange in the semi-finals.

The defeat of Collingswood High at the Elizabeth Armory, 35-27, made Griff's team the runner-up to Memorial High of West New York; and on the next Saturday the two teams met, again at Elizabeth. At the start the West New York team had the upper hand, and at the half, because of a great advantage in height, it had more than a ten-point lead over the Red and Blue. In the closing seconds Memorial led, 38-37; then came a splendid shot by Duffey and the game was over, 39-38.

For the second successive year the team captured the Inter-Orange League Championship; and for the first time in the school's history it won the New Jersey State Tourney. This remarkable record must be attributed to the able coaching of Stanley Griffin and to the outstanding playing of

the team as a whole.

Soccer

 Under the able guidance of Coach Stanley Griffin the 1939 soccer team ended the season with an outstanding record. Winning five games, tying three, and losing two, the team showed plenty of fight and will to win. This year's squad brought forth two men whose names will probably be heard of in seasons to come: Joe Sassano, who played brilliantly on both offense and defense, and Bill Rabbitt, who showed ability in the forward line. Opening the season with a one-to-nothing victory over a strong Verona team, the Red and Blue next battled to a one-to-one deadlock with Montclair. Meeting a hard fighting Summit team, they eked out a one-point victory in the last minutes of play by scoring on a penalty kick. The following game against Chatham, who previous to this time had been undefeated in twenty games, showed an East Orange team that could not be equaled, toppling the Chatham booters two-to-nothing. After this win, the team was defeated by the famed Harrison squad, five-to-three. Playing a return game at Montclair, they won by the two points tallied by Roselle and Modugno. A rainstorm prevailed through the entire afternoon of the scheduled meeting between East Orange and Kearny, Group Four soccer champions. Both teams fought hard on a muddy and slippery home field upon which East Orange was handed its second defeat of the season. Hard as the team fought, the players were unable to shoot the ball past the Kearny goalie. This defeat was reconciled by a three-to-nothing victory over the Chatham squad at their home field. The game stood at a scoreless tie at the half, but in the second half the spectators saw an East Orange team that only time could stop from scoring, with Roselle tallying two of the three points, and Lucas shooting the third. The season ended with games with Verona and Summit both ending in ties, one-all. The Summit game showed Tony Bellina, playing his usual brilliant and hard-fighting game, tying the game with a superb head shot past the goalie.

Though there will be a great loss of valuable men, "Griff" will have those men who did not quite make the varsity this season and Joe Sassano,

the only letter man, with which to form the 1940 squad.

• In the spring of 1939 the East Orange Tennis Team for the third time in as many years was crowned champion of Northern New Jersey by the New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association. To achieve this honor the Red and Blue netsters went through their fifteen-game schedule without a single defeat. As a contrast to the two preceding years, when it had been co-champion, the team was this year acclaimed sole ruler of the state interscholastic tennis world.

When the season opened, Coach Davis was faced with the problem of forming a team from recruits who did not include a single letter man. Walter Weller, elected captain, had seen service the previous year but not enough for a letter. From nineteen candidates, John Lowther, Everett Manning, Bill Conkling, Charles Jasik, Douglas Hiley, and Ken Boehm were selected to form, with Walter Weller, the squad which fared so well during its season under the management of Harry Silver. Conkling, Manning, and Weller will return to the 1940 squad with Weller as captain.

• Always rated among high schools as a power in track and field events, the East Orange track team lived up to its reputation by sweeping through the season without a single loss in a dual meet. As for the larger meets, the team won second place at the Princeton Interscholastics, third in the Newark Open Meet, and third in the State Meet.

Starting with a win over West Orange in a practice meet, the Red and Blue went on with the same spirit to overthrow Thomas Jefferson, Westfield, and West Side in dual meet competition.

This year the team was especially strong in the pole vault, in which event it had a trio, Jim Kessock, Fred Burley, and Dick Whitehead, who among them captured first in every meet. Bill Booth ran the hundred and the two hundred and twenty-yard dashes. Bob Burke ran the quarter-mile most of the season but switched to the dashes in the state meet. Seymore Hundley, state champion half-miler in 1938, also successfully covered this distance for the 1939 squad.
