1937-1938

1938-1939

Coach George Shotwell first became prominent that year in E.O.H.S. by molding our football material into an excellent team. Sharing honors with the pigskin carriers were the tennis and basketball teams. Also bringing honor to the school were the band and trumpet trio which came out on top with highest possible ratings at the National Competition in New York City.

Guiding us through that year were our class president, Edward Roberts; vice-president, Richard Hamilton; and secretary, Natalie Gottfried.

1939-1940

With proud hearts and joyful countenances, we took our places as upperclassmen—at last able to enjoy our inherited rights of misleading the lowly freshmen. Sweet revenge!

Our football team had a brilliant season—in fact, we placed second in the state. We were undefeated—tying Nutley 6-6. (Disgusting, isn't it?) All this, of course, was due to the superb coaching of George Shotwell. Basketball, all in all, proved

quite successful, for during the season we lost but three games. Contrary to popular opinion, we snatched an unexpected victory in the finals of the state basketball tournament with a last-minute score by Duffy (of the order of '40). The fencing squad, led by Rufo Sanchez, finished a tough season of 18 meets, having lost only four. The tennis team, swatting the ball through an undefeated term, also made us strut with pride. This made the third consecutive time that we had come off the courts proudly bearing the royal banners of the state interscholastic championship. Our officers that year were Edward Roberts, president; George Tuttle, vice-president; and Dorothy Shaw, secretary.

Pat Stands Pat, a musical comedy, set the tempo for the rest of that gay, memorable year. Impromptu acting by Ozzie Porter was combined with superb vocalizing by Marjorie Hall and Ed Rustum to give the audience more than its money's worth.

Afterwards, the year afforded the fine performances of *Pyramus and Thisbe*, *The Lost Elevator*, and *Eager Heart*, and went out through *The Double Door*.

1940-1941

At the start of the year, a common cry of the seniors was "Golly, we made it! It was a hard fight, Mom, but—battered though we may be—we finally got here. Think of it—we're seniors!" After a per-

iod of growing accustomed to the respect reserved for seniors, we finally came "down to earth," and settled down to the full enjoyment of our last year in E.O.H.S.

Close on the heels of the Autumn Dance came Gilbert and Sullivan's operetta, *Ruddigore*, featuring from our class, Marjorie Hall, Bill Tippet, John Ambrose, Barbara Bolash, and Ray Voegtlin. This production was considered the best since *Robin Hood*, which is real praise.

In the middle of the winter season came the Junior-Senior Prom and, as one of the pleased terpsichoreans so aptly put it—"Twarn't a flop, either." Indeed it was far from being a "flop." The student body really coöperated on this dance and made it a success financially as well as socially—which is really something to boast about. Don Price and his boys surely were "hep" that night; lovers of "sweet" music had their chance at the slow romantic rhythms while the jitterbugs went to town in faster tempo. Who will ever forget that prom?

Now as the *Syllabus* goes to press, we have much to look forward to—the annual play, *What a Life*, the spring concert, *Hora Novissima*, the All-State Orchestra's second get-together at Atlantic City, our trip up the Hudson, the Grad Dance, the nice, gruesome exams we must undergo, and to top all that—graduation.

Well, our tale is told and we take our leave. See you on graduation day—we hope. 'Bye now.

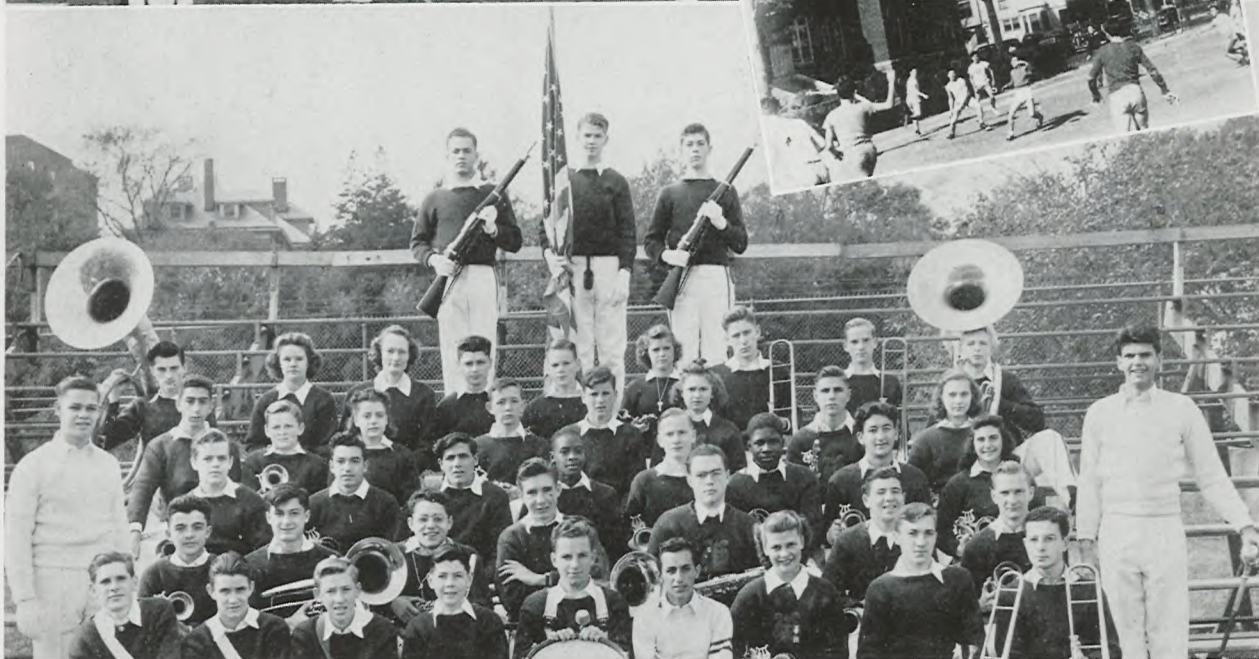
An important amendment to the constitution concerning tennis was made this year as follows:

● The football season of 1940 was not so good as one could wish, considering our five defeats, two ties, and two victories; nevertheless, we did have a team that was always fighting.

The season began with a deadlock with Cranford. The Red and Blue battled the Cranford gladiators to a 0-0 score. On the next Saturday we met a supposedly strong West Side squad. The Panthers outplayed them throughout the four quarters, but in a last-minute pass, fumble, and recovery, West Side made a quick touchdown, which left us on the short end of a 7-0 score. After this defeat the Colonels from Morristown felt the fangs of an angry Panther to the tune of 19-7. Then came the second letdown of the season when the Red and Blue met West Orange and lost to it. The Mountaineers were outplayed by our plucky squad which, however, lost the game, 7-0, because of a trick play by West Orange. We next defeated a stronger-than-usual Plainfield team, 13-7. In this game the first string halfback, Jack O'Donnell, was severely injured, and his inability to play during the rest of the season was a serious setback to the team. Then came the disaster of 1940 in the form of an aerial bombardment by Montclair that caused our team to lose, 35-7. In this encounter, we also lost another regular man, George Cortez, through a minor brain concussion. After the Nutley game had been postponed because of bad weather, we dropped one to Orange, who had dynamite Frank Ruggiero, and again to Columbia, on whose team deceptive Jack Hansen played. The scores were 19-7 and 7-0.

Our forty-fourth meeting with Barringer at Newark Schools' Stadium closed our season with a bitterly-fought game which ended with a 0-0 deadlock. The kicking of Barringer's Fred Westphall kept the Big Blue from being scored upon by a plunging Panther backfield in the form of Jim Collins, Frank Greco, "Lefty" Cortez, and dynamic Edgar Lindstrom.

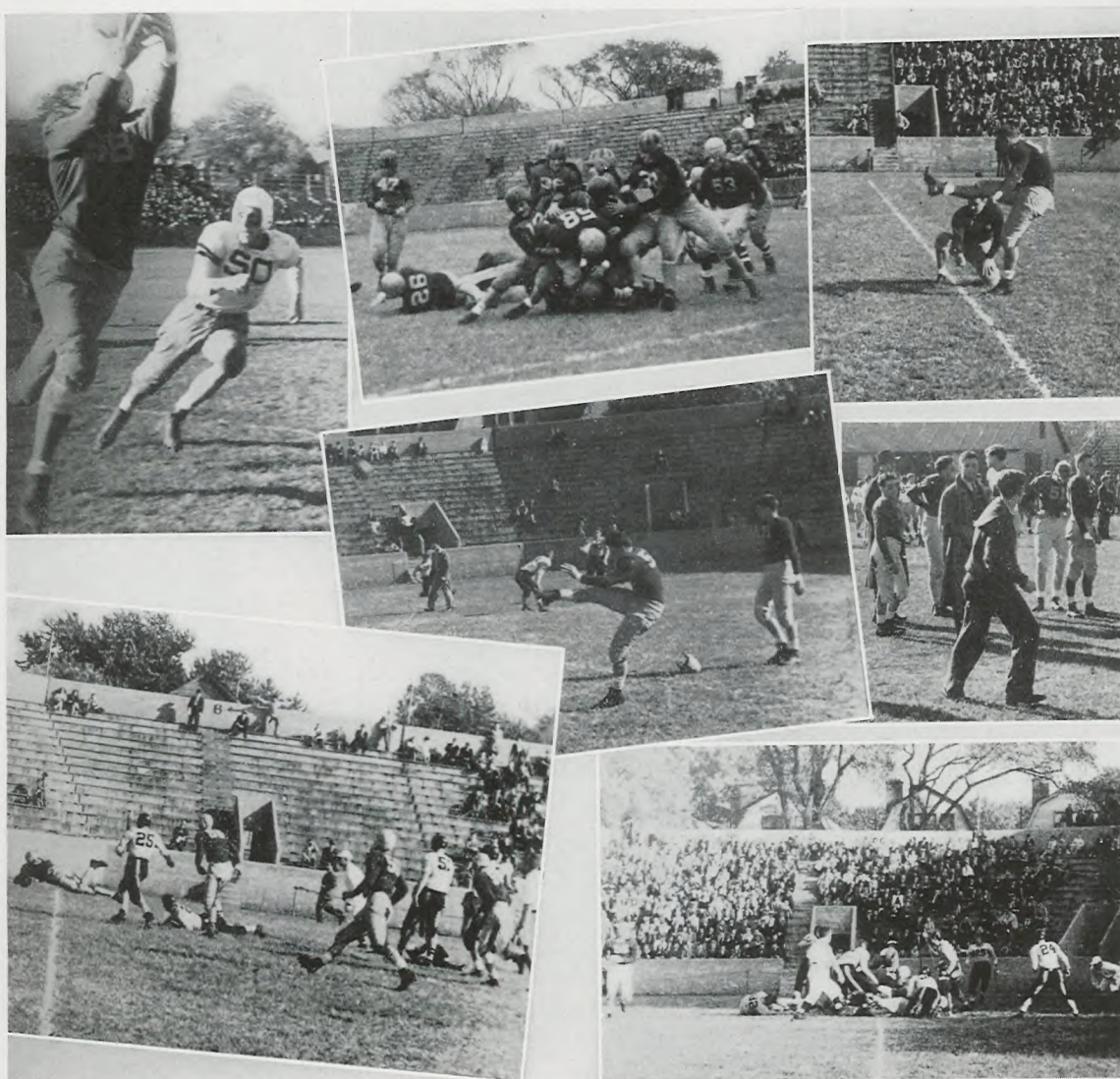
