Dedicated to the purpose of clear verbal expression, orally and written, the English Department takes pride in its goal to educate students to their fullest extent.



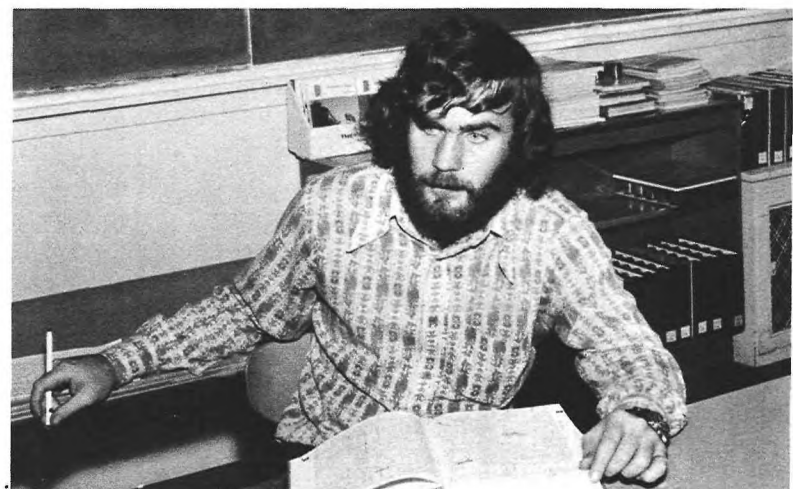

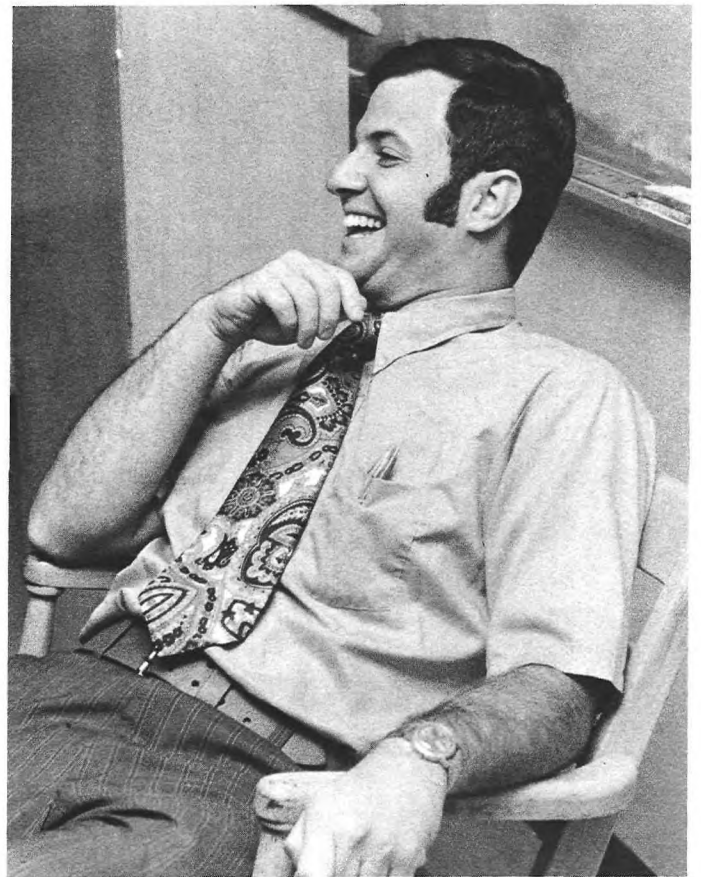
The Social Studies Department offers a balanced program of studies with a variety of courses which a student may take.

FOREIGN LANGUAGE

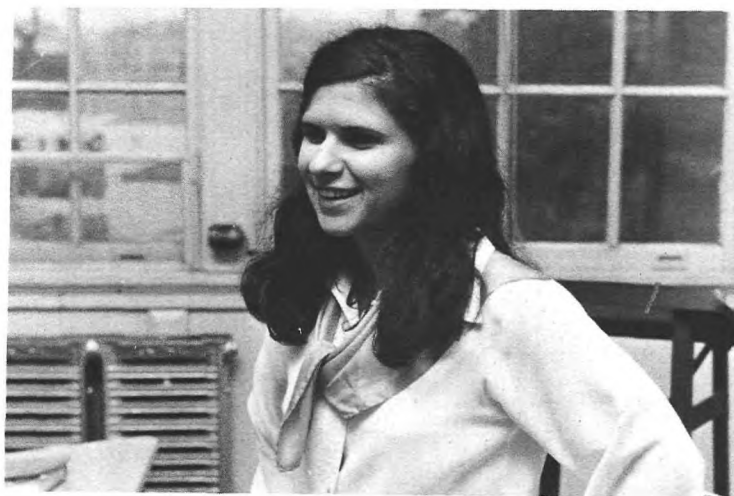

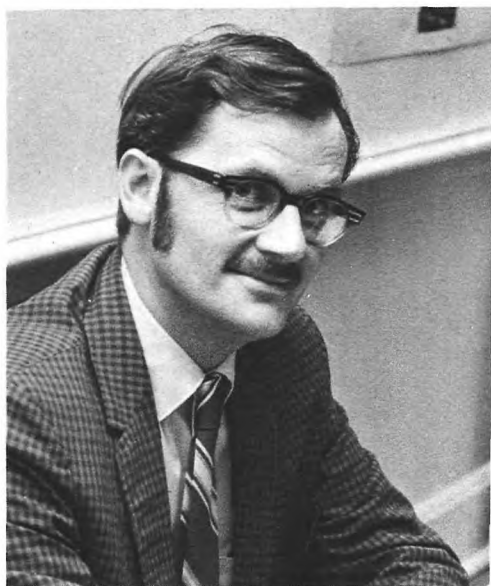
It is hoped that every East Orange High School student will participate at least two years in a foreign language and bring the world together through understanding.



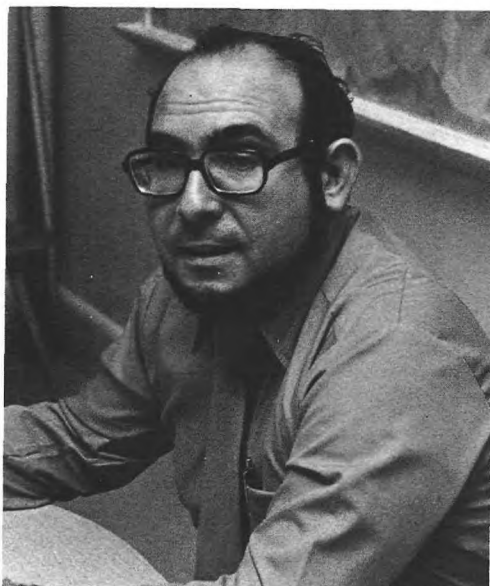

The physics course along with important lab periods helps the student understand the laws of nature and how they relate to the surrounding environment.

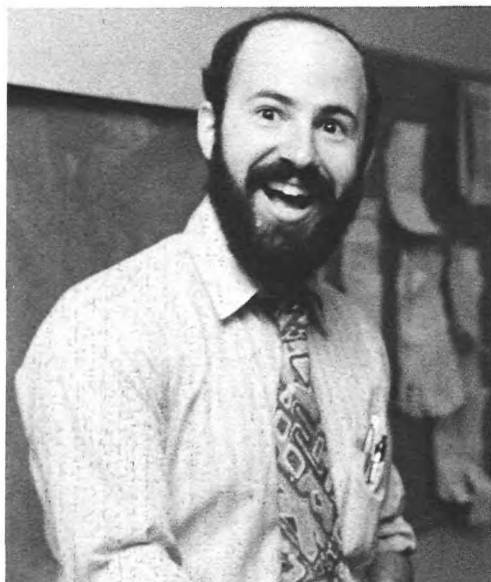
Chemistry explores reactions of materials and elements of the periodic table, and their importance in everyday living.

A library helps to shape the minds of the students that pass through it, with the abundance of knowledge stored within.

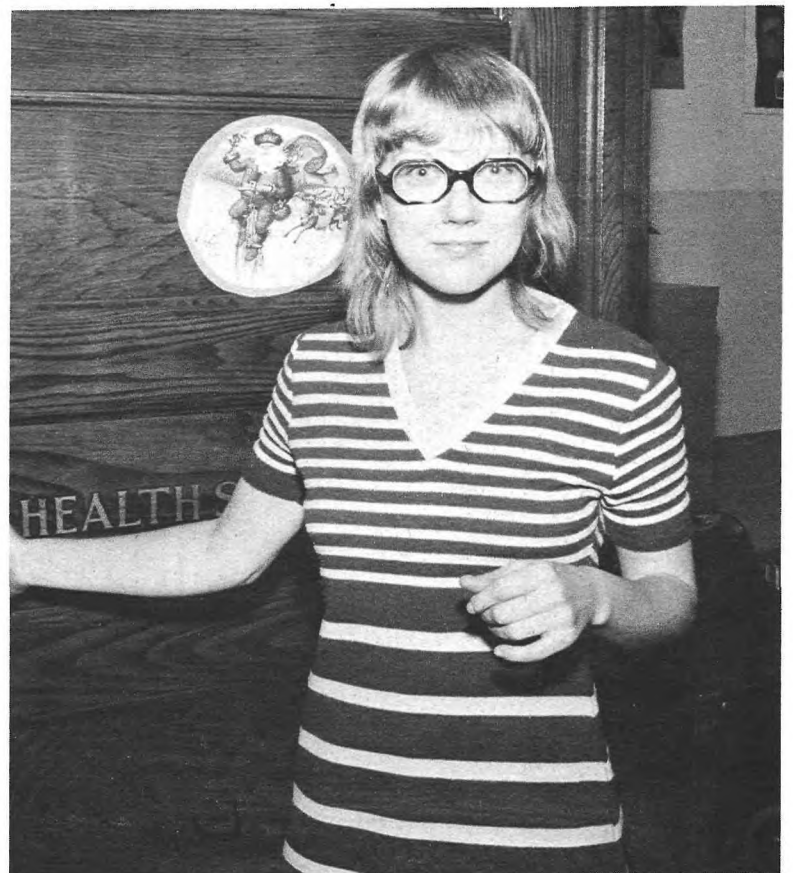

In the past three years East Orange has dominated the Big Ten basketball conference and this year was no exception. Some new plays and ideas utilizing speed and skill came about for the team, to make them a unique group of young men. Under the guidance of a new coach, Robert Lester, the Panthers captured three outstanding titles this year.

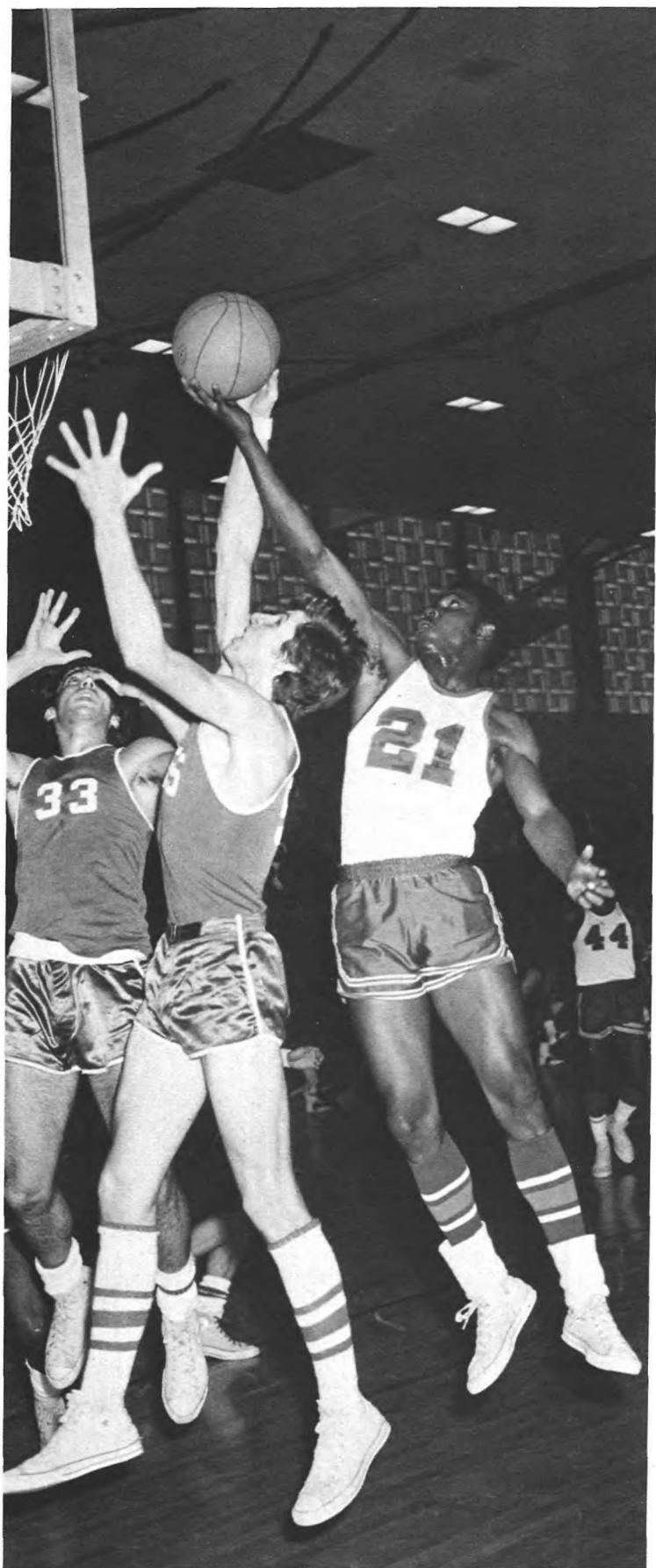
The team, led by All-State selection Mike Dabney, started off with nine straight victories to set the stage for the rest of the season. The Panthers then lost a one-point heartbreaker to Orange, 82-81. In our next confrontation with the Tornadoes this loss was avenged by a crushing victory, 111-82. East Orange went on to take the Big Ten crown for the fourth straight year, with a record of 17 wins and one loss.

Seeded as the second place team in the Essex County Tournament, the Panthers, with the agility and speed they had shown during the regular season, defeated three straight opponents to gain a berth in the finals of the ECT. The final game with top seeded Weequahic was a disappointment to all, as the Panthers seemed overmatched by the overtowering Indians. Pitted against superior height, the East Orange quintet went down fighting, 86-78.

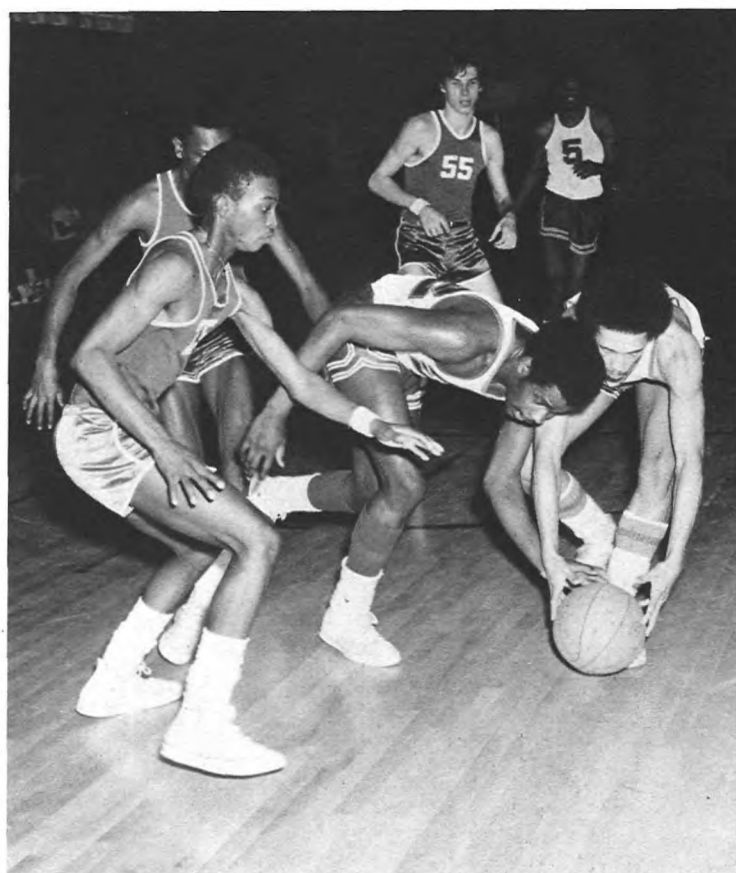
This was the year for comebacks, as East Orange entered the State Group III tournament and asserted itself by defeating strong Mountain and Hillside teams. The sectional final was a rematch between East Orange and Weequahic and the State Championship hung in the Balance. This time the Panthers were not to be denied as they defeated Weequahic 74-51, rolled past Ferris in the semi-finals 71-68, and crushed Lakewood in the finals, 85-60. With these victories East Orange compiled a record of 25 wins and two losses and swept three championships, Big Ten, State Group III and Star-Ledger State Champions.
