Since the first publication of our paper, HARAMBEE, there have been many meetings that all students should be aware of. The Comprehensive Planning Study Committee haas been reviewing and discussing with resource people the interim report, which is now available in our school library. It is now possible for concerned students to read this report and voice their opinions, criticisms, questions and suggestions.

## Group III State Champs

Lost to graduation, it seemed, went the power and balance that contributed so much to East Orange's successful season and the State Title in '72. But with his imagination and ability, Coach Bob Lester constructed an even greater balanced team for 1973. The result, a second precedented State Championship for the Panthers.

Losing only five games the entire season, the Panthers finished fourth in the State top twenty and second in the Essex County top ten. Seeded third in the E.C.T., the E.O. forces, with the ability and speed of any fine team, took on strong opponents such as Orange, Montclair and Barringer, only losing the final game by one point to Central.
This was the year of the Panther, as East Orange roared through the State Group III tournaments by defeating Mountain, Caldwell, Summit and finally overwhelming a tall N. Burlington team, 68-54, for the State Group III Championship.

The Panthers were led by All-Essex and AllState selection Ken Young, and talented players Mike Booker, Kim Fisher, Reggie Baker and Ray Smith. Also augmenting the team with their fine efforts were Michael Williams, Derek Williams, Cleveland Eugene, Tom Ivery, Tony Tillman, George Bagley and Tyler Jenkins.

Highlighting the season was the announcement of Coach Robert Lester as the Coach of the Year.
