As your high school representative, I will make sure all students' written comments are brought to the attention of the board.

Proceeds from the pageant will go toward the publishing of the school yearbook.

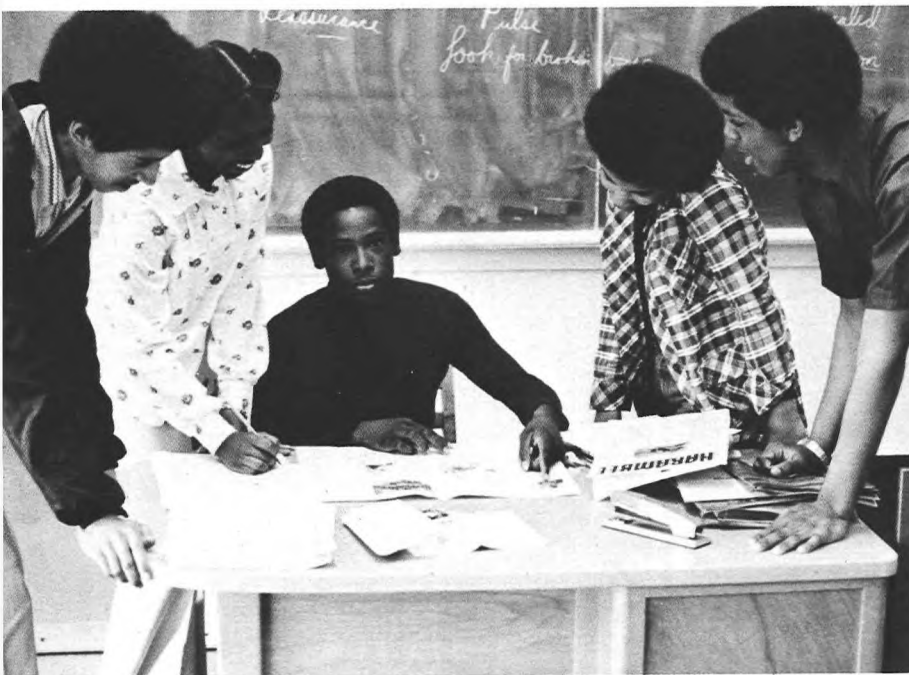

But with his imagination and ability, Coach Bob Lester constructed an even greater balanced team for 1973. The result, a second unprecedented State Championship for the Panthers.

Highlighting the season was the announcement of Coach Robert Lester as the Coach of the Year.

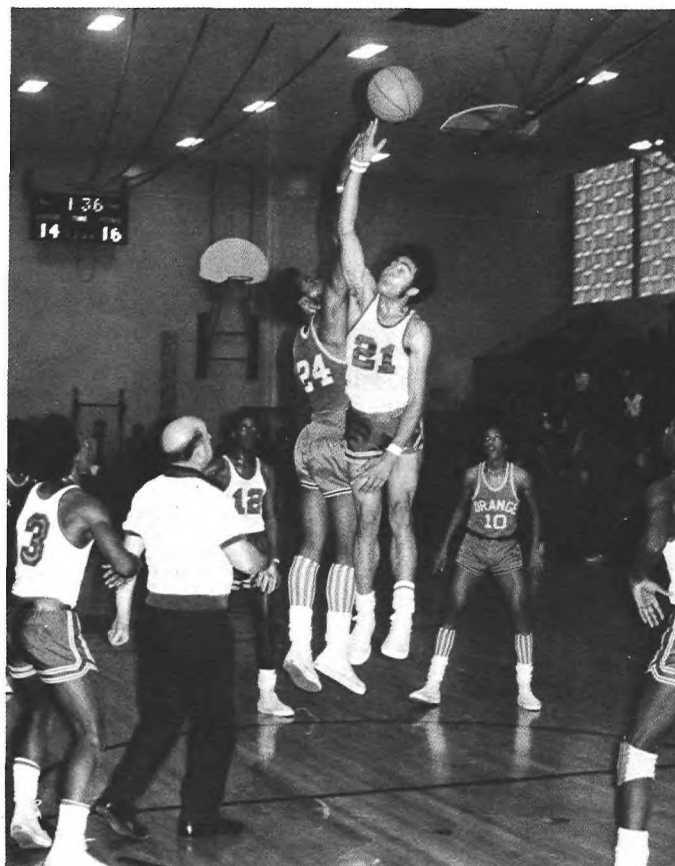

Science is defined as the knowledge of facts and laws arranged in an orderly fashion, and the search for truth.

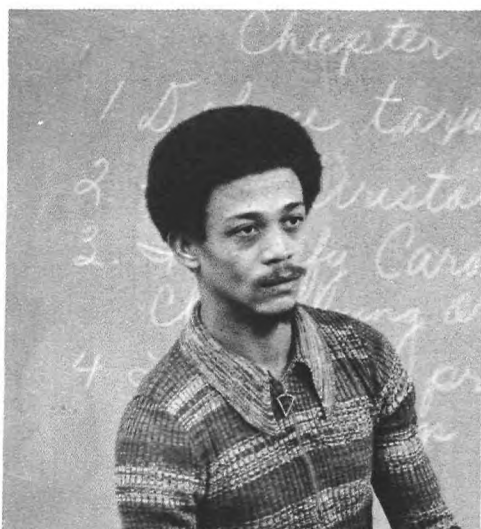

The combined courses give the future drivers valuable information, so that he will operate a better and safer car.



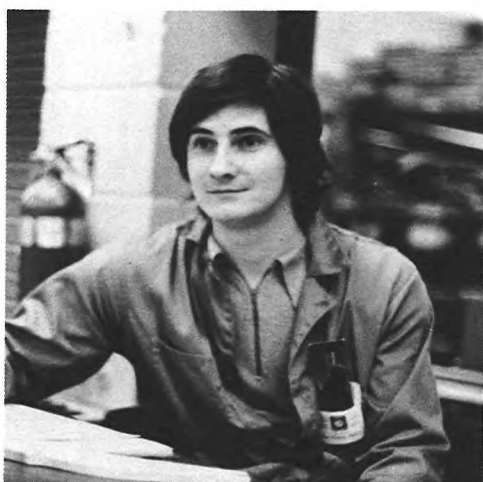
INDUSTRIAL ARTS
