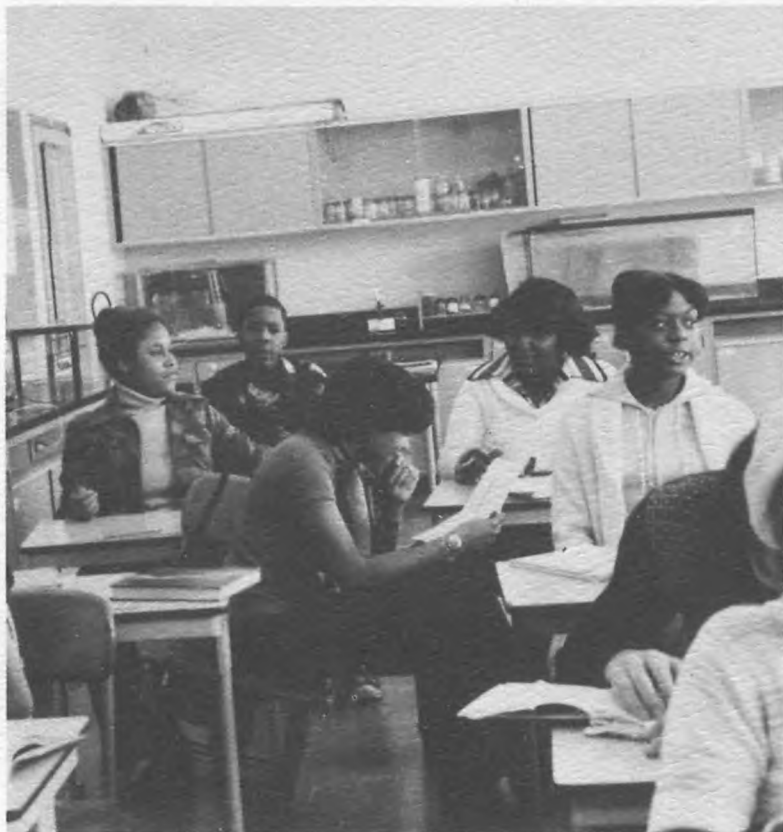


A place where it happened

are people . . .

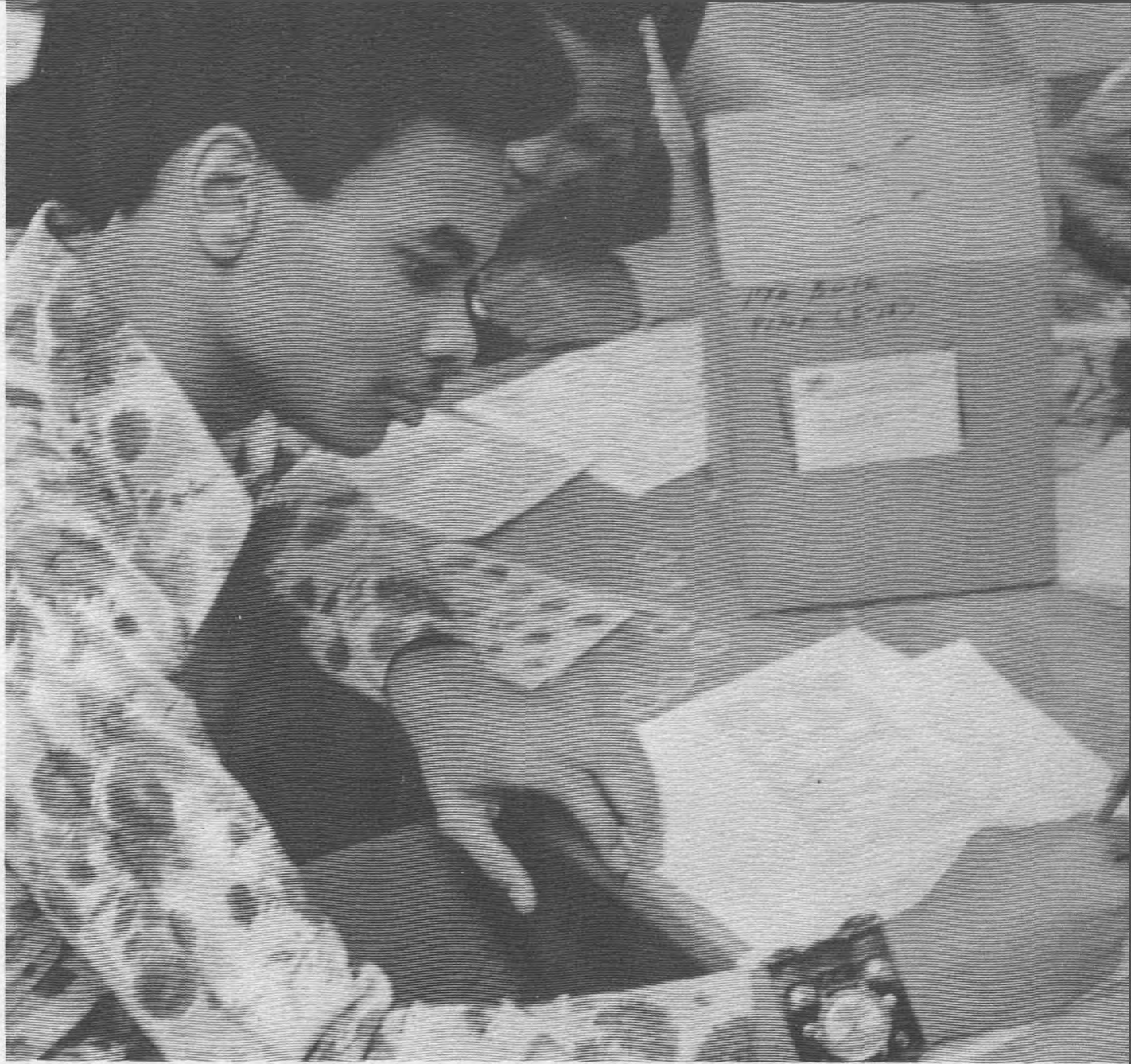

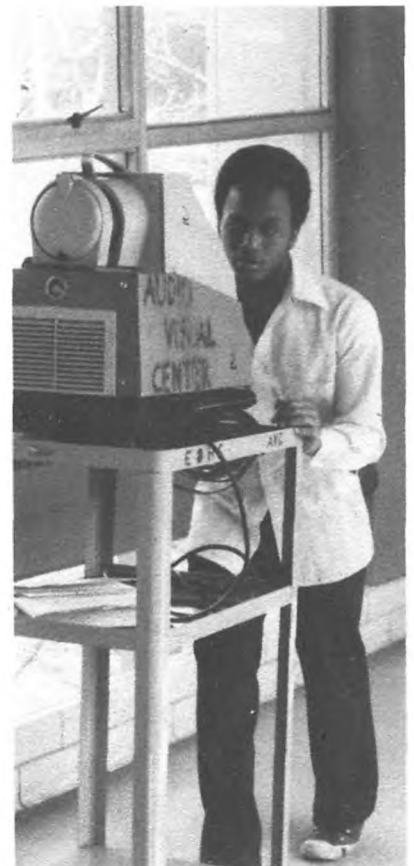

College Board Tests What it's all about

This article is about the College Board Tests which are given about nine times a year. These colleges and universities use an estimation of a student's average capabilities in a specific subject as require at least an S.A.T. (Scholastic Aptitude Test) score to fairly evaluate a student's academic school. Since the S.A.T. and the Achievement Tests are basically the same, we will use the S.A.T. article rather than constantly naming them both.

The S.A.T. goes by a fairly easy way of scoring. In the first place, all the questions are weighted equally. There is just one right answer for each question. Your sheet is corrected by a computer, which takes 1/4 points off for an incorrect answer, and subtracts it from the number of right answers. This raw score is then converted to the College Board scaled score (200-800), and your reported score is determined from that.

The majority of colleges have a similar way of interpreting your test results. It generally consists of comparing your scores to those of the students already in the college. A rank is therefore computed for you in relation to that college. That rank is called your percentile rank. Your chances depend, therefore, on how high or low your rank is. The higher, the better your chances of getting in the college.

Also, in interpreting your scores, it must not be forgotten that the administration officers take into account everything that may have any effect on your performance in high school and therefore on your S.A.T.'s such as school environment, curriculum, etc. This helps to judge scores more justifiably.

However, even though your S.A.T. is a basically good estimation of your performance in high school, this is definitely not the only thing they look at. They also place much emphasis on extra-curricular activities, good recommendations, and an honest desire to work. Your S.A.T. score is more important to some officers than the S.A.T. which only tells

- 1) The English, Science, Math, Social Studies and Foreign Language Departments should aid students in the preparations for the Achievement tests.
- 2) Classes to help students gain college skills should be added to the curriculum.
- 3) Summer school programs with local colleges should be established.
- 4) Present courses should be reviewed

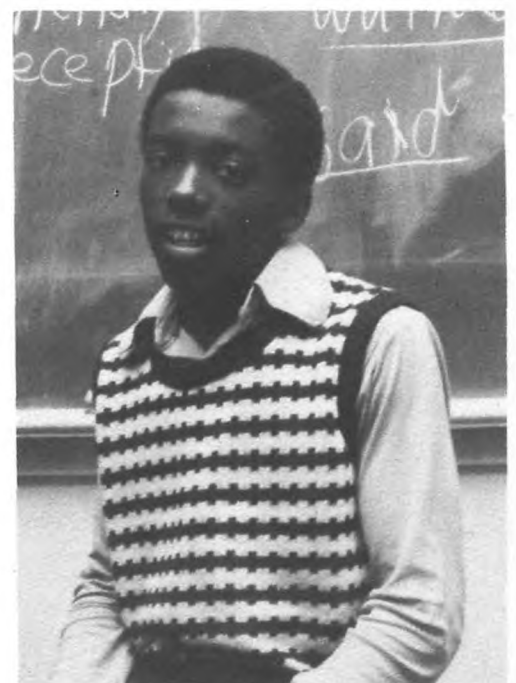

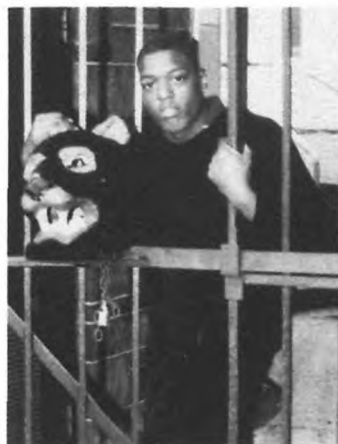

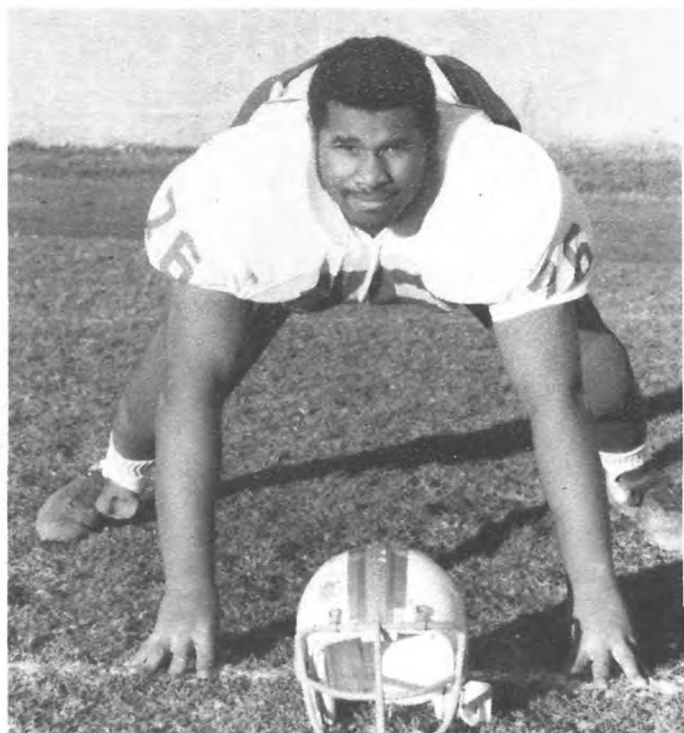


hopes of the Panthers were not fulfilled there still remained an optimism of returning players of the squad.

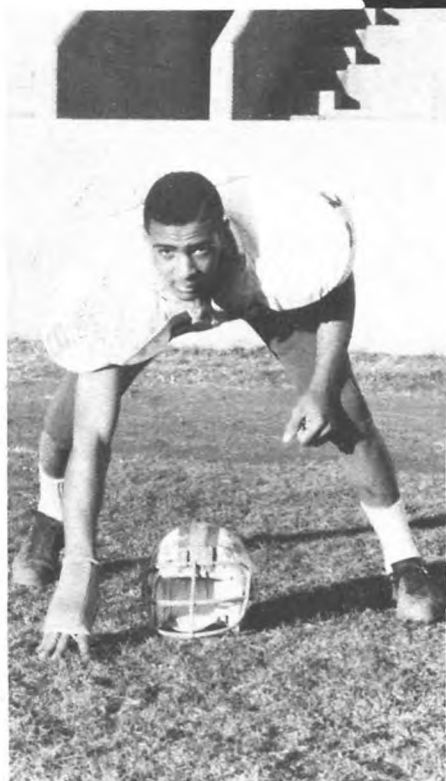

The E.O. Panthers opened the '75 season with a great deal of confidence. With three returning starters from the championship club of '74, the Panthers would have a great opportunity to capture still another championship.

Returning starters included: forward, Rodney Williams; forward, Cleveland Eugene and guard, Michael Booker. Booker was called upon this year to make the transition from a forward position to guard. This move was made to make room for the two starters: center, Melvin Hall and guard, Tyrone Miles.

The Panthers opened the season by defeating Central 81-73. The next game

final few minutes of the game, when the "Express," led by Booker and the clutch play of Cleveland Eugene, prevailed and sent Essex Catholic to its first and only defeat of the year 85-80.

In addition to the superb play of Booker and Eugene, E.O. was aided by the play of co-captain Tyrone Miles and starters Rod Williams and Melvin Hall. Reserve Daryl Roberts came off the bench to score eleven big points and nail down undisputed number 1 ranking in the state.

With the winning streak extended to 34 games the "Express" launched their drive toward the Group III State Championship. The team won their next five games, only

Flyers indoor season victorious

Staying with a solid group of returning vets, Head Coach Richard Ross and assistant Coach Cal Weems, Jr. piloted their squad to State Group III Relay and Big Ten Conference Championships, and a few team and individual records and titles.

The mile and 880 relay squad of Darell "Doctor D" Richardson, Charles "Charlie J" Johnson, Gregory "Happy" White and Kevin "Charisma" Shoats took off the Group III 880 Relay Championship, establishing a new State Group record for this event (1:33.6). Later that evening, the same quartet won the

mile relay championship, on the strength of White's anchor leg. The team garnered the team title and plaque, along with eight gold medals.

Next, the Panther Flyers ran away from last year's State Champs, Montclair, and a powerful Columbia squad to win the Big 10 Conference Indoor Track and Field Meet.

Kim Miller, veteran shotputter from last year's campaign, started the Panther quest for the title at Columbia H.S. gym where the shot was held.



Miller's toss of 53'8" broke the school record set last year by Essex County Champ, Jesse Butts. Despite this record toss, Miller was edged for first place, by a narrow $\frac{1}{2}$.

The following day saw the Panther track unit in action at DeMuro Oval, Nutley.

Shoats got the ball rolling by winning the 60 yard high hurdles, setting a Big 10 record of 7.6 seconds for this event.

Junior stars Johnson and Beaumont Munford came across the line 4th and 5th, respectively, in the 60 yard dash.

White, in his debut the 880 yard run, took third place.

Later, Richardson came back from a starting mishap in the 60 yard dash to lead a E.O. 1-2-3 sweep of the 440 yard dash.

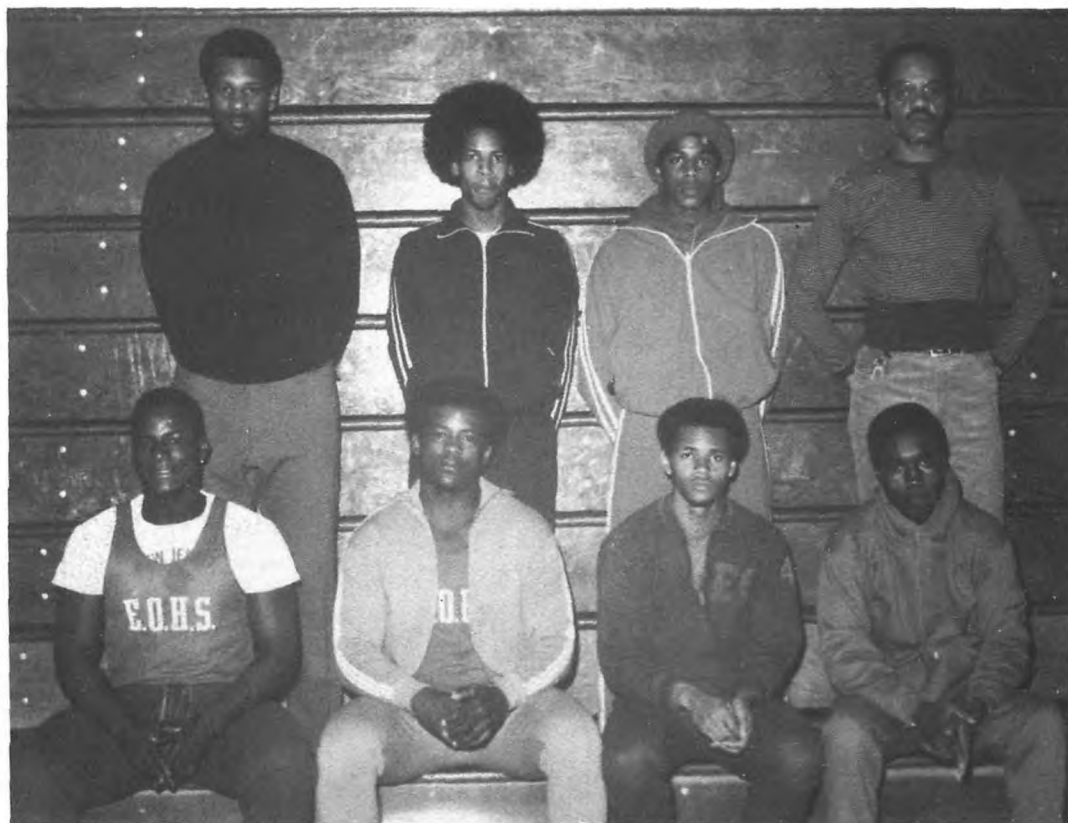
A few minutes later, the mile relay squad (Shoats, White, Johnson, and Richardson) won their second title of the year, and clinched the Big 10 team championship for E.O.

Richardson, a four year veteran of indoor campaigns, got what he had waited

for so long to get, a state championship, at Jadwin gym, Princeton University. Darell won the Group 3 60 yard dash title, running away from the field with a time of 6.4 which tied the school record.

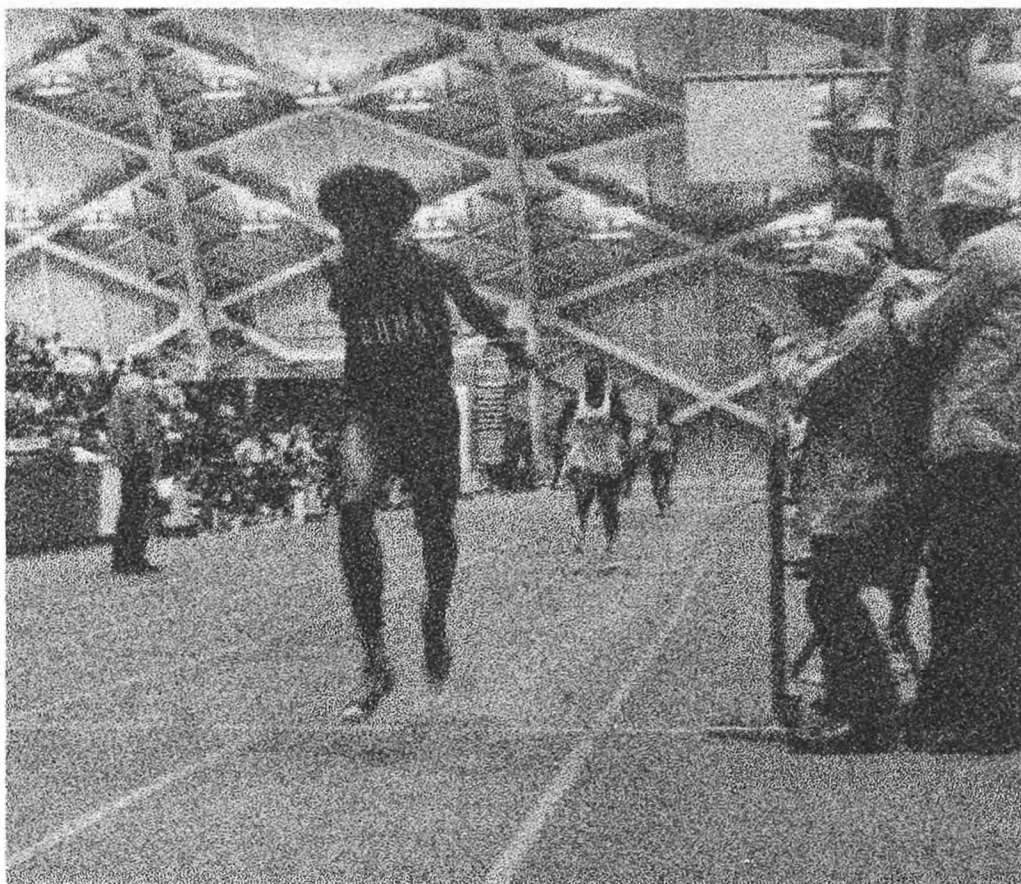

Even though this would be a very large improvement, the nucleus of a contender



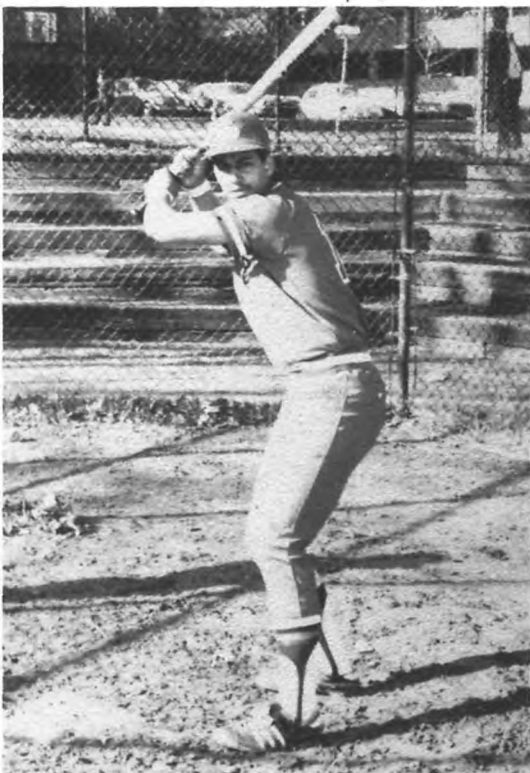

After two initial defeats, the Panthers came back to win their next two games. This hopefully is a sign of things to come in the minds of the "75" Baseball Panthers.



Yet all of these familiar places and important events would have been meaningless were it not for the people participating. Yes, the essence of the whole thing lies in the fact that it takes people to make it happen.

So, the 1974-75 school year comes to an end, and the books are closed once again. What happened here may have been good, bad, or perhaps indifferent, but, nevertheless, it happened here.
