Some might say it was a Cinderella Team. Others might say the Panthers were overdue. But all in all the 1975 Football Panthers were by far one of the premier teams in the state.

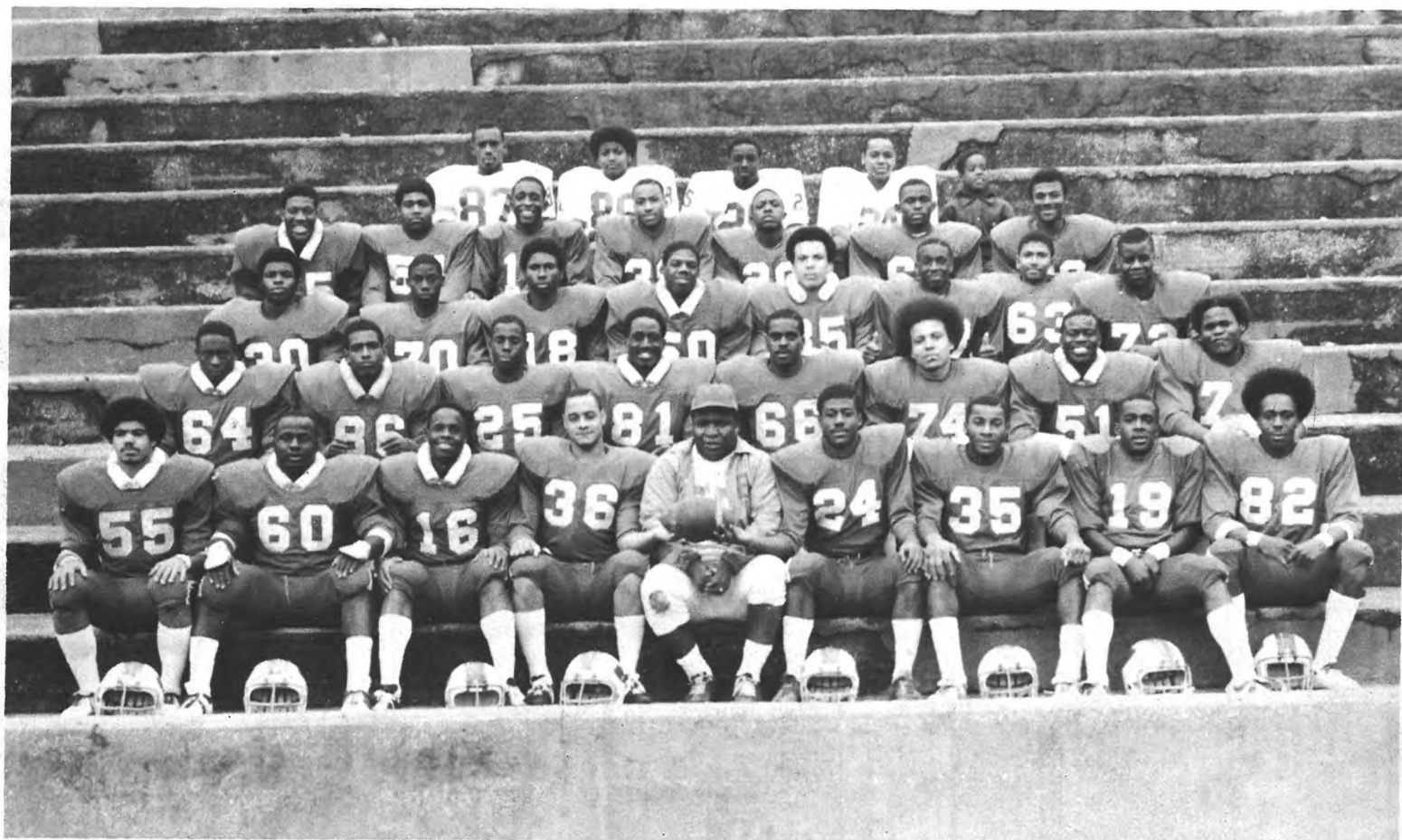
There were individual stars who could be singled out as main factors in the Panthers 7-2 season, best since 1968, but the success was mainly due to team effort and outstanding coaching.

One of the less popular sports in the High School, Bowling, has quietly become a powerhouse along with the likes of our basketball, football, and track teams.

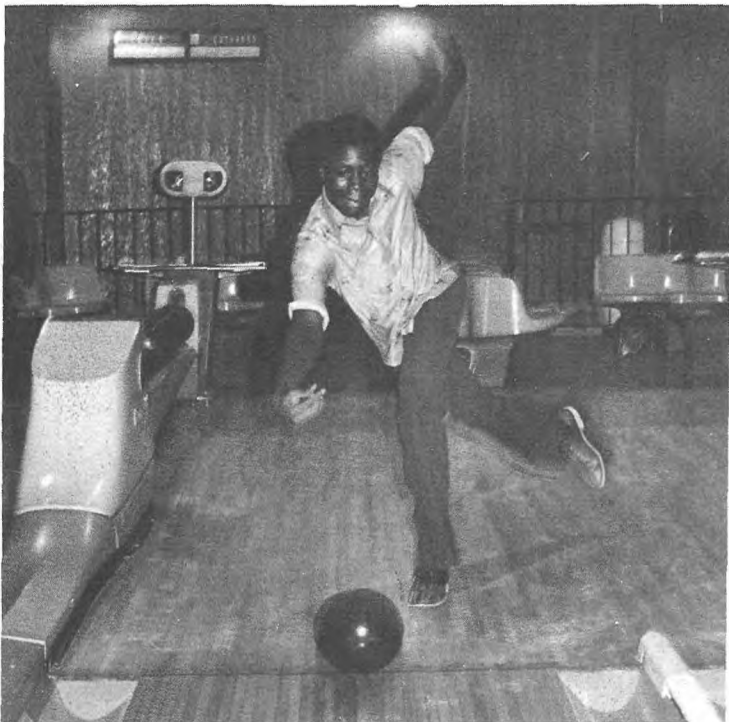

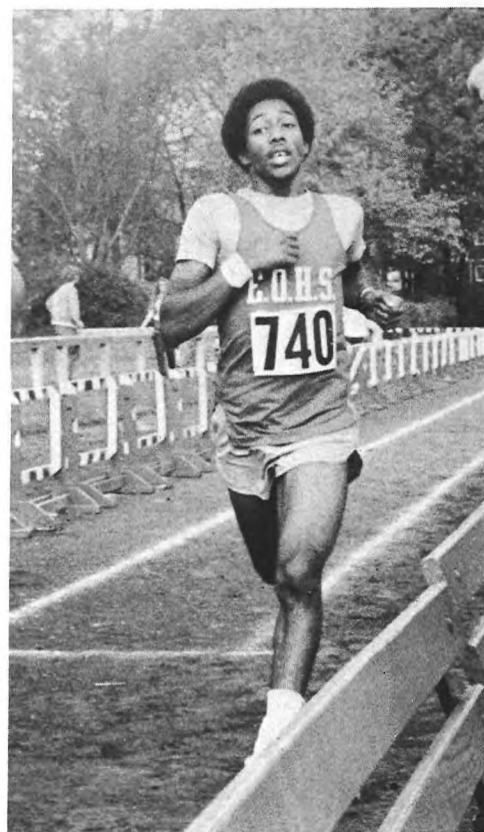

Next was Orange. When it was over, the Panthers had come to age. The score was 14-4 and Orange was sent home wishing they had never come.

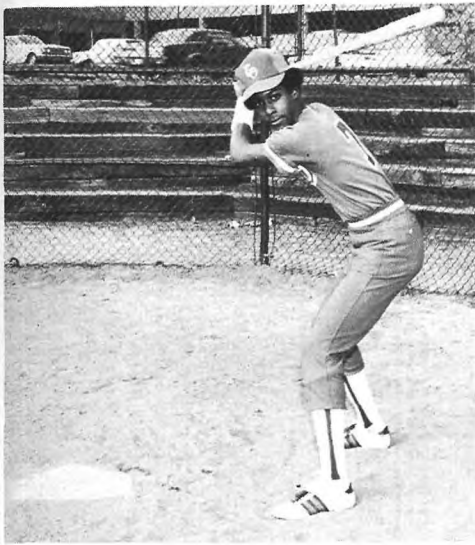

Junior, Cathy Baker breaks 1000 pt. mark

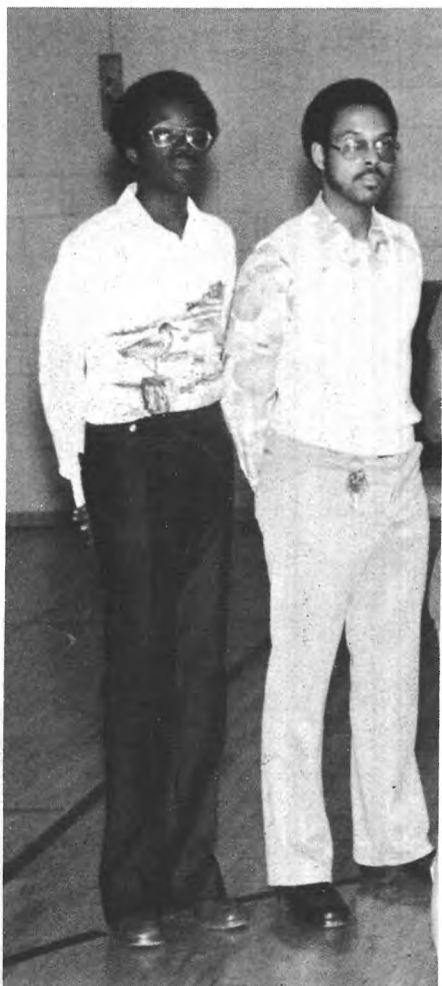
In only its second year of interscholastic competition, the Girls' Basketball Team once again demonstrated the proficiency of East Orange High School female athletes.

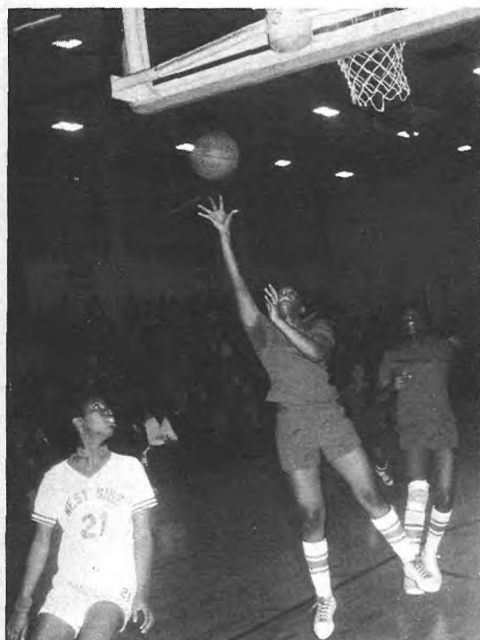

"Dream Team" takes revenge at the expense of Bloomfield

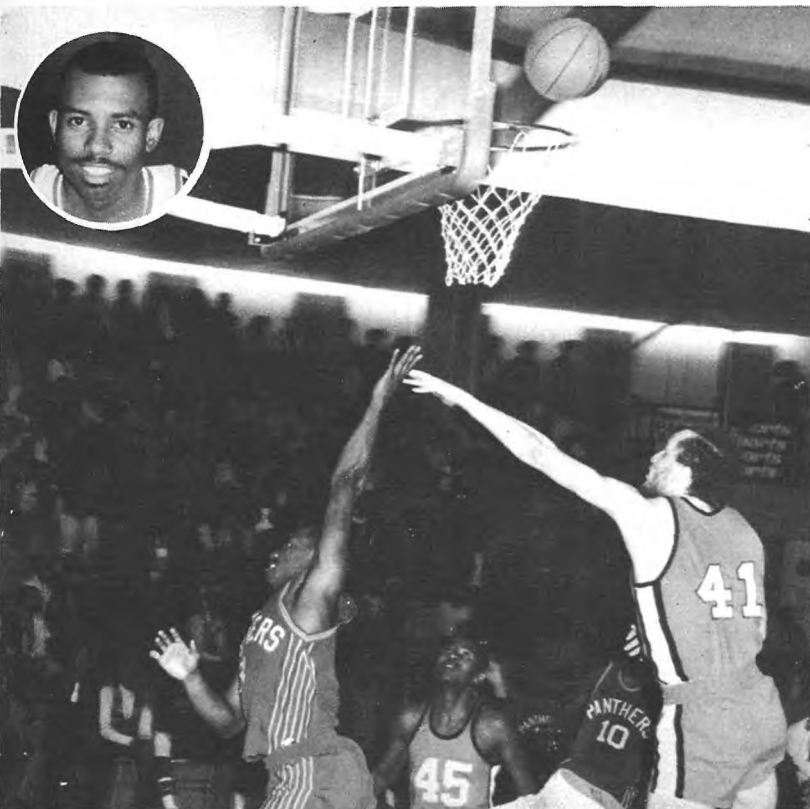

Team" had more to accomplish than just another State Championship. Neptune's loss gave them the chance to come out on top as the number one team in the state.

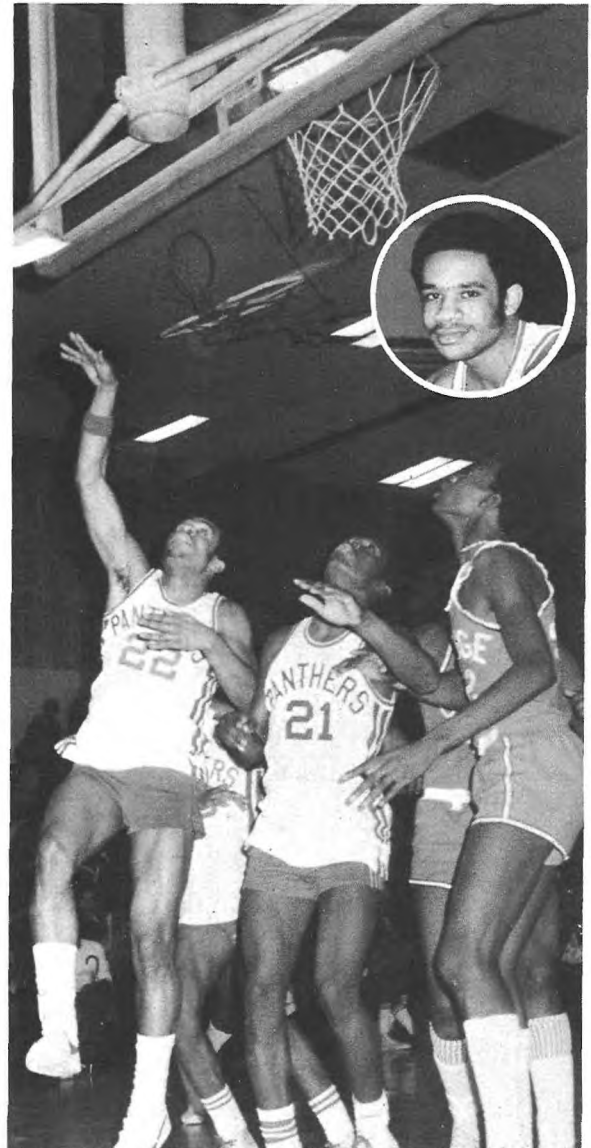

Student governing takes on new look



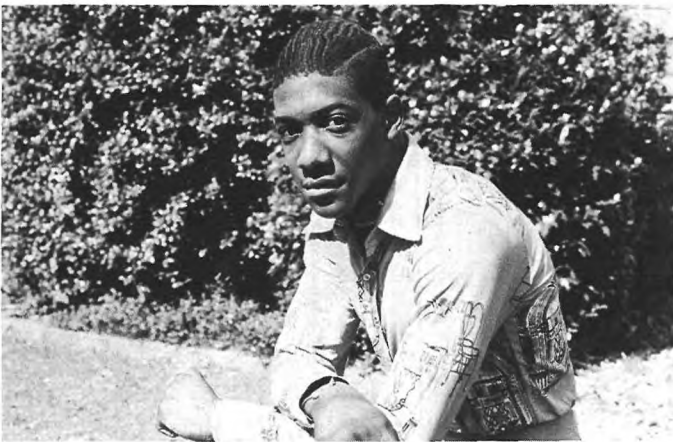

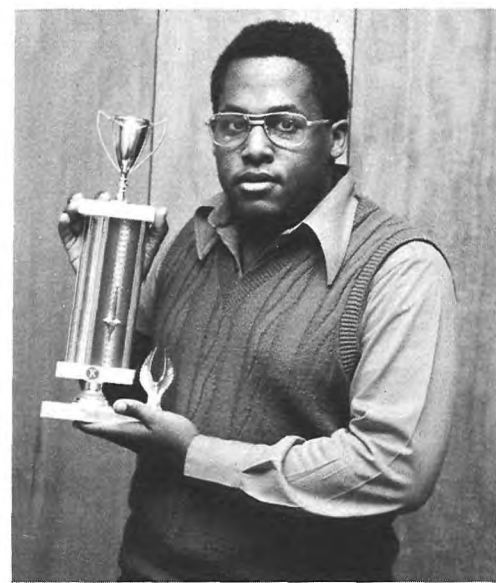

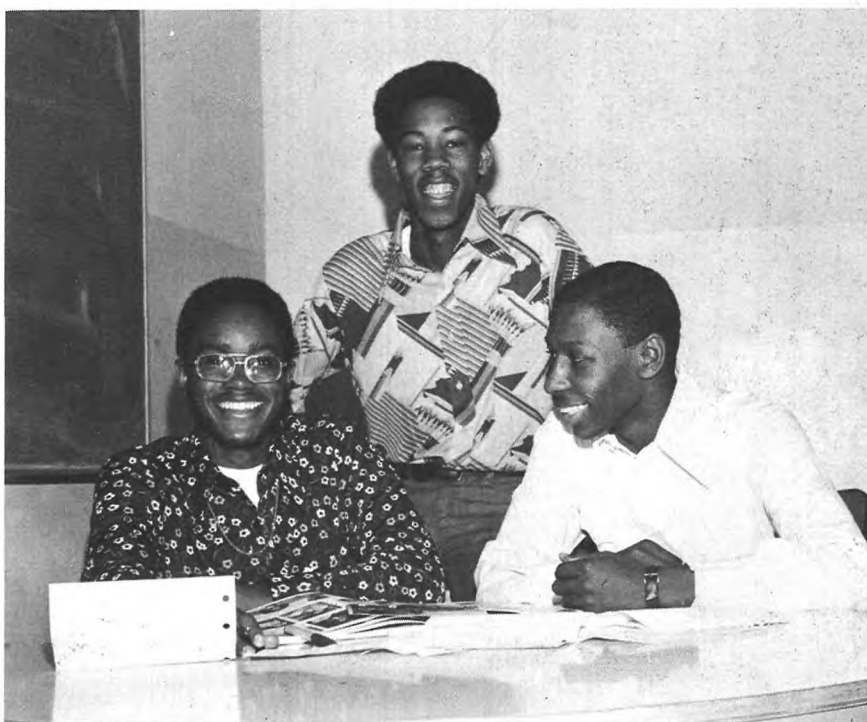

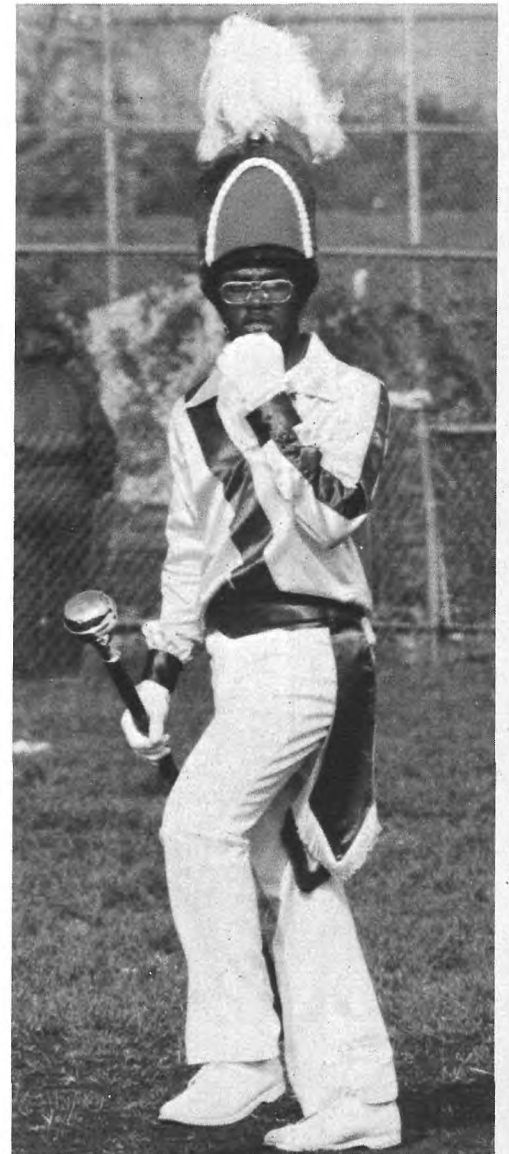

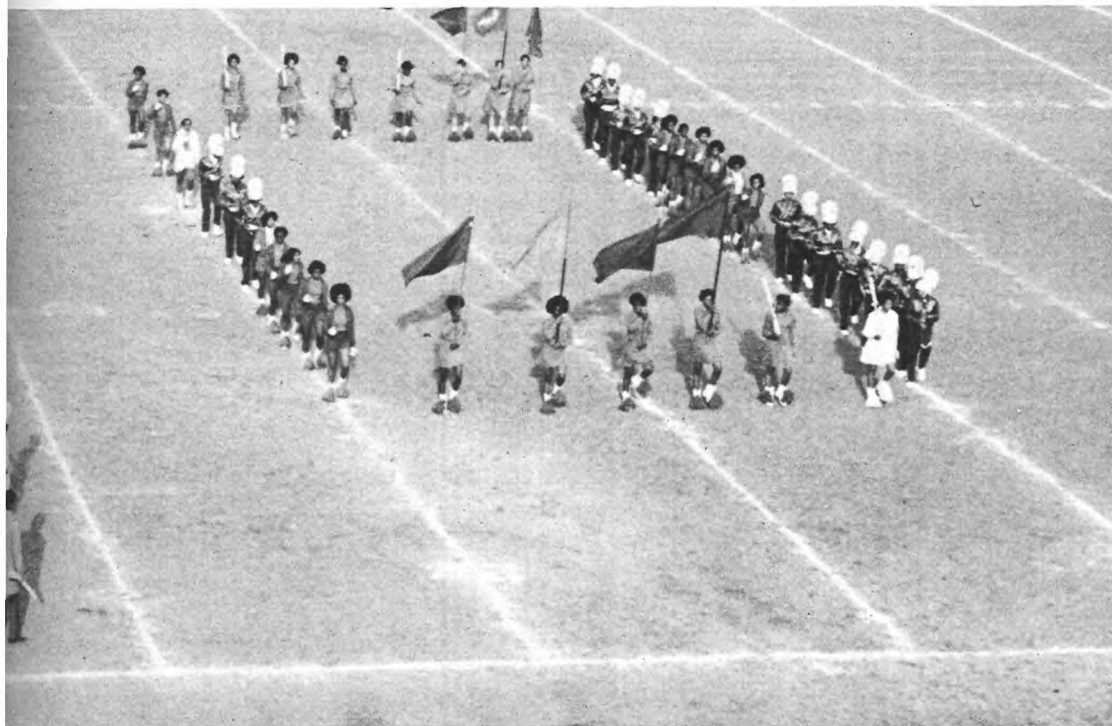

Contrary to what their name indicates, the Trammps are familiar with anything but Philadelphia's infamous skid row.

The Trammps are a tightly-knit group of eleven talented and versatile young musicians from the City of Brotherly Love. They were signed to Atlantic Records in June, 1975, and their debut single, "HOOKED FOR LIFE," was released within a few weeks. The Trammps consist of Jimmy Ellis (lead vocalist), Robert Upchurch (vocals), Earl Young (lead bass singer, drums), Stanley Wade (bass, vocals), Harold Wade (guitar, vocals), Michael Thompson (drums), Eddie Cermanski (keyboards), Rubin Henderson (sax, flute), Presley 'Artie' Williams (trumpet), Harold Watkins (trombone), and John 'Rusty' Jackman (bass).
