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

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




Webster's dictionary describes a FORCE as a strength or power. The power to control, influence, persuade or convince.




































The year also brought about a renewed interest in science fiction with the emergence of the film "Star Wars". The movie dealt with the FORCE.








In the movie the FORCE was described as "An energy field generaby living things. Only certain individuals could recognize the FORCE what it was, and even fewer could make use of it.



New Providence 27 East Orange 6









The Lady Panthers approached the 1977 - 78 basketball season with a certain degree of pessimissim. The loss of four graduating seniors contributed to this uncertainty. For the first time since their inception the Lady Panthers would be playing without the services of former E.O. standout, Kathy Baker, now playing for Queens College.

The Lady Panthers opened their season with an impressive 63 - 39 victory over Bloom-field. The offense was particularly effective with sophomore Janice Walker, senior Elaine Settle and freshman Paulette Bigelow combining for 42 points. The scoring was balanced with seven members of the Lady Panthers contributing to the score.

The next stop on the schedule was Montclair. The Lady Panthers cold not put it together and suffered a 20 point loss at the hands of the Mounties. The loss did not deter the "Ladies" and they rebounded for a 44 - 34 defeat of Irvington.

The "Ladies" fought a hard battle with Columbia only to come out on the short end of a 68 - 43 victory by Columbia. (Columbia's only loss was a 1 point defeat at the hands of Willingboro in the state finals.) The record now stood at 2 - 2.

Captain Elaine Settle scored her season high of 21 points in leading the Lady Panthers to a victory over Kearny at Kearny. The next four games against Belleville, Orange, Bayonne and Montclair found the "Ladies" on the losing end with the record falling to 3 - 6. It didn't end there though. Next stop was crosstown rival Clifford Scott. Again the Lady Panthers found themselves losing, but to another strong state contender.

Finally the "Ladies" met Bloomfield again. This time victory wasn't so easy, and they eeked out a 45 - 43 verdict. The Lady Panthers felt good about their victory and their play seemed to improve. Belleville set them back again, but this time it was a 1 point heart-breaker that made the difference.

A victory over Irvington preceded the next Bayonne game. The Lady Panthers still had the taste of defeat in their mouths from the first Bayonne thrashing. This time it would be different. Although the result was the same, the point difference was quite different. The Lady Panthers clawed their way in this game but fell short 49 - 40.

The "Ladies" were waiting patiently for their next opponent, arch-rival Orange. The patient waiting paid off as the Lady Panthers upset the highly regarded Tornadoes. The Panthers took a comfortable 9 point lead at half-time, however Orange fought back and closed the gap to 1 at the end of the third period. The "Ladies" were not to be denied and sealed a 62 - 55 victory in the final period. A balanced scoring attack once again by Settle (18), J. Walker (19), Bigelow (16) and a ferocious rebounding job by senior Deirdre Taylor (24) proved to be the winning combination. The Lady Panthers finished the regular season at 6 - 9.

In the first round of the Essex County Tournament the Lady Panthers had the misfortune



Panthers finish season 18-5

Farewell Bob Lester Welcome Ken Macklin.

The Panthers began the 1977-78 basketball season with plenty of questions to be answered, one of which was: who would fill the shoes of the legendary Bob Lester as head of East Orange High School Basketball, Inc.?

On November 15, 1977, Ken Macklin, former J.V. coach, was selected as varsity coach and head junior varsity coach position was filled by Ron McDonald.

With new head coach, Ken Macklin, leading the way, the Panthers began their attack on the 1977-78 season by winning their first eight games before being halted by the Eagles of Essex Catholic by the score of 72-69.

In the first game of the season the Panthers, led by their only returning starter, Craig Euston, blew past the Bengals of Bloomfield by a score of 77-56, to begin their eight game streak.

The Panthers went on to win their next five games in convincing manner, beating Montclair 64-47; Irvington 73-72; (in overtime) Columbia 78-65; Kearny 86-83; and Belleville 85-61; capturing sole possession of first place in the Big Ten Conference and second place in the Top 20 Poll.

Next the Panthers faced their arch rivals, the Tornadoes of Orange, in Orange before a standing-room only crowd. The Panthers surged ahead early by exploiting the famed East Orange fast-break, which gave them a half-time lead of 40-31. In the second half, the East Orange attack, led by the likes of senior guard George "Silk" Ramsey, who scored 19 of his game high 21 points, again unleased its lethal fast-break to overcome the strength of the Tornadoes. Final score-East Orange 75, Orange 69.

Next the Panthers defeated the "mighty" Mounties of Montclair 65-56 for the second time of the season.

For the first eight games of the season, losing was a word unknown to the Panthers, but in the next game the Panthers fell, along with the 16 inches of snow that fell that evening.

For the first time in two years the Panthers played the Eagles of Essex Catholic on their home court, and for the first time in the school's history the Panthers were defeated by Essex Catholic.

The Eagles jumped ahead of the Panthers and took a commanding sixteen point lead into the locker room at half time. The Panthers fought back, relying on that tight, pressing, defense for which the Panthers are known. With less than two minutes remaining, the Panthers gained a one point lead, behind the combined scoring attack of senior forwards Kenny Daniels and Charles Blue, but it was to no avail. The Eagles capitalized on a technical foul called during an inbounds play and scored another basket, as time ran out on the Panthers. The loss ended the Panthers winning streak and also put the Panthers in a tie for first place in the Big Ten Conference.

This loss did not stop the Panthers. The mighty East Orange, Inc. bounced back, slowly but surely, to beat Bloomfield in an overtime battle, which saw "Super-Sub" Derrick Williams come off the bench to clutch two free-throws to send the game into overtime. The talented Panthers came back from a five point defecit with less than a minute remaining.

The suspense filled overtime went scoreless until senior guard Craig Euston came up with the clutch steal, passed it up court to forward Ken Daniels, who fed George "Silk" Ramsey underneath to score at the buzzer.

The Panthers went on to beat Belleville and Irvington by the scores of 53-50 and 81-51 consecutively.

The Panthers now riding high again, went into the Eastern States Classic confident, only to lose two heartbreaking games at the hands of West Philadelphia High and Rice High School of N.Y.C.

East Orange Inc. opened the tournament against the number one seeded team, West Philly featuring 6'7", 200 lbs. All-American Clarence Tillman. West Philly was figured to be an easy victor, but the Panthers figured differently.

The Panthers went to war against the awesome West Philly team, behind the scoring attack of George Ramsey (21 points); Derrick Williams (20 points); and Charles Blue (12 points) who came off the bench with an injured knee to spark the club to within three points at the half. In the second half the size and power of the West Philly team proved to be too much for the small, but talented Panther squad. The Panthers fell once more, this time in the hands of Clarence Tillman and Co. by the score of 80-67.

For the first time in four years the Panthers lost two games in a row. The Panthers were to lose their third game of the season second in a row to a team from the playgrounds of New York City.

The Panthers were looking to avenge their loss to West Philly against Rice Catholic, but were turned back in the final quarter. Rice took a 78-77 lead with six seconds left in the game. The Panthers were to get two chances at winning, but a jumper by Billy Marshall from the corner and a last minute desparation lay-up by George Ramsey wouldn't fall Final score: Rice 78, Panthers 77.


The Panthers snapped back, getting their only chance for revenge over a team that had defeated them. The Eagles of Essex Catholic came to East Orange thinking of a second win over the Panthers and a Big Tell championship, but left with neither as the Panthers produced a total team effort to turn back the Eagles by the score of 62-58.

Next, the Panthers were to play arch rival Orange again. A win would clinch a Big Ten championship and give East Orange bragging rights for one more year.

Once more the efforts of senior guard Craig Euston (21 points) prevailed as the Panthers proved too much for the young Orange team The Panthers over-powered the fired-up Tornadoes 77-74.

Tournament time came for the Panthers and many fans faced it with doubt in mind.

The opening round of the Essex County Tournament featured the Panthers against cross-town rival, the Scotties of Clifford Scott High School.

The second round of the E.C.T. matched the Panthers against the Mounties of Montclair, for the third time this season. This game, unlike the others, went down to the wire. The Panthers prevailed when Ken Daniels was fouled on an inbounds play and calmly sank two free throws, which proved to be the games winning points. E.O. 65, Montclair 65.


The spectators at the E.C.T. semi-finals witnessed a feat not accomplished in many years. For the first time in over seven years the Panthers were defeated before the final round of the E.C.T. Shabazz jumped ahead of the Panthers in the first quarter 20-6. They led the rest of the way until the third quarter, when the Panthers surged back, only to have Shabazz go on a 10 point tear that settled the game. The Panthers were knocked out of the E.C.T. finals. Final score: Shabazz 70, E.O. 55.

The Panthers regained their momentum going into the State Tournament, hoping to prove to everyone that they were a championship club.

East Orange, Inc. began their assault on the Group IV State Championship by blowing past their first two opponents, Nutley and Bloomfield, by the scores of 74-47 and 83-67.


The Panthers went to the semi-finals of the sectionals pitted against Elizabeth at the Robert B. Redman Gymnasium before a capacity crowd.



For the first time in 6 years the Panthers were not 20 game winners. However, due to extreme weather conditions, three regulary scheduled games had to be cancelled. Two of these








Coach Macklin takes a time out to get things in perspective.

The 1977-78 season also marked the demise of the Big Ten Conference-one of the most powerful in the state.

The final record was 18-5. Four of the five losses occured in Tournament play. A loss to the third ranked team in the nation, West Philadelphia, was followed by a 1 point defeat to perinnial New York City powerhouse Rice Catholic. The two other losses were to fifth ranked Elizabeth and tenth ranked Shabazz. The only regular season blemish was to state tournament semi-finalist Essex Catholic, a loss which was avenged later in the season.
