2 The British Prime Minister announced the separation of Prince Charles and Princess Diana. Sympathy leaned toward the princess, who retained custody of sons Will and Harry.

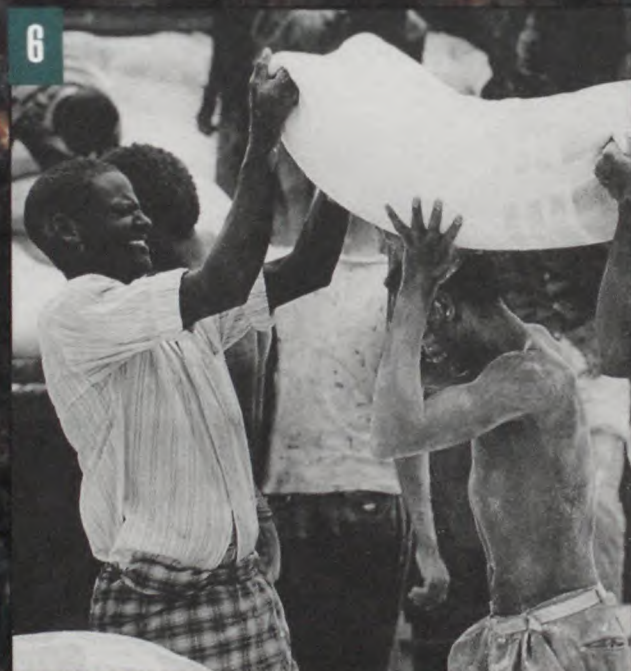
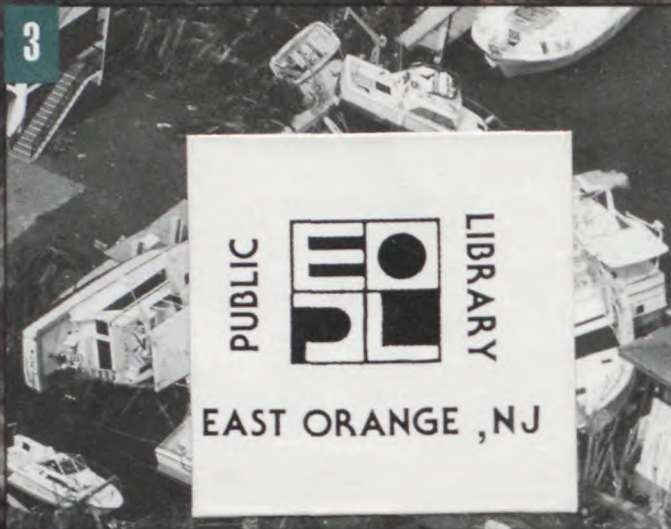

5 The comedian host of "Late Night With David Letterman" for 11 years on NBC switched networks. CBS offered Letterman, a favorite of the younger audience, a \$42 million deal.

6 The U.N. allies airlifted food supplies to Somalians devastated by drought and civil war. The U.S. dispatched marines who cleared a path through looting and fighting so supplies could reach the starving.

7 The second year of the Lollapalooza Tour, part rock concert, part circus, featured rapster Ice Cube along with Pearl Jam, the Red Hot Chili Peppers and others. The Concourse of Oddities and Curiosities drew the alternative crowd.

2 Arkansas Governor Bill Clinton became America's 42nd president. Clinton and running mate Al Gore defeated Republican incumbent George Bush and Independent H. Ross Perot with their campaign of change.

3 Low-impact step aerobics invigorated over 11 million exercise enthusiasts. Even George Bush gave it a try at The Great American Workout, sponsored by the President's Council on Physical Fitness and Sports.

4 The U.S. Post Office made headlines when it announced the Elvis Presley Stamp and asked the public to vote on a young or old likeness of the legendary rock-and-roll star. The young Elvis graced the 29¢ stamp.

5 The Toronto Blue Jays took the World Series, winning against the Atlanta Braves, four games to two. In the 11th inning of the final game, Dave Winfield drove in two runs to lead the Blue Jays to a 4-3 victory.

6 The movie *A Few Good Men*, with Jack Nicholson, Tom Cruise and Demi Moore drew crowds across the country. This military courtroom drama commanded some of the biggest box office receipts of the year.

Reverend Stovall earned a Bachelor of Science degree from Stillman College, Tuscaloosa, Alabama, and taught Spanish and biology in Dothan City Schools.

During this time, in 1970, he married Robbie J. Ingram. Soon after, he relocated to East Orange, New Jersey where his son, Ahmid Rashawn Stovall was born.

He was employed with the East Orange School Board of Education at East Orange High School as a science teacher. He dedicated 22 years of service to the East Orange school system. He retired on September 1, 1992.

Reverend Stovall was called to the ministry and ordained in 1987. In December of 1987, he was installed as pastor of the Greater Promise Church. As a result of his touchable character, many students were influenced to walk the road of success. He fervently labored with students who many times had no desire to ride the swift horse of success.

An integral part of Rev. Stovall's promotion of academic success for students at East Orange High was his unselfish and spiritual leadership. He helped many students to break the cultural barriers of ignorance and work together to create a climate for academic excellence.

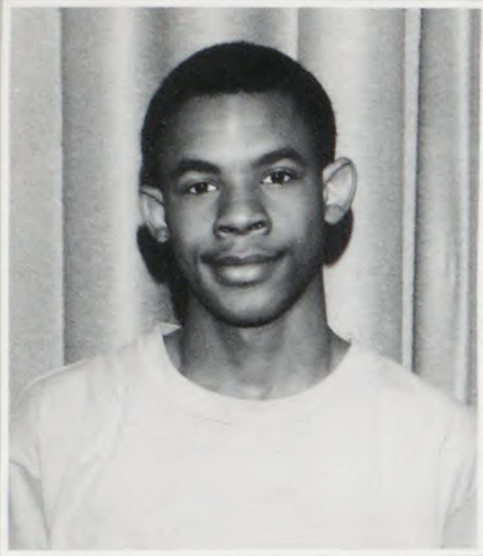

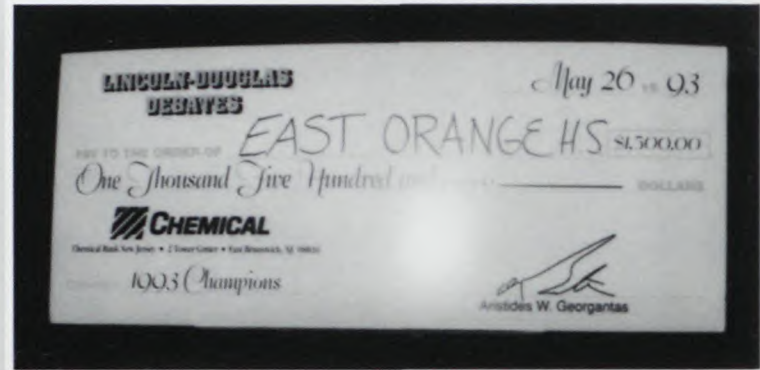

At home, our country celebrated the 500th anniversary of Christopher Columbus' voyage to the New World.

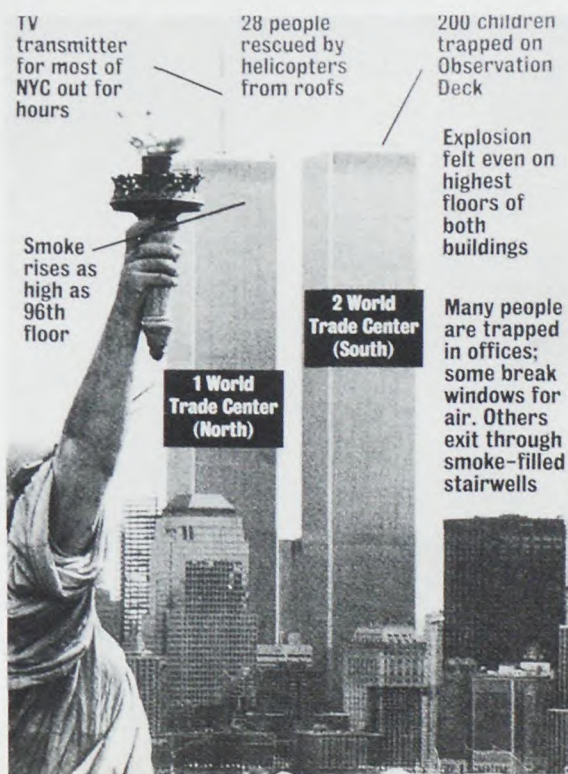
